This week's Parsha contains the ways to recognize a Metzora. Later in Parshas Naso, we find a command **וישלחו מן המחנה** that the Metzora, as well as other Tumos, is sent chutz la'machane.

The Satmar Rebbe in Divrei Yoel asks why does the Torah express the consequences of a Metzora, Zav etc. in a different way than other commandments within the Torah? Normally, the Torah talks to the person who is obligated to carry out that commandment. For example, if a woman is divorced, the Torah says that she is not allowed to marry a Kohen. It doesn't speak to Klal Yisrael to ensure that a Gerusha doesn't marry a Kohen. Here, the Torah expresses its language in a commandment to the Jewish people -- **וישלחו מן המחנה** - why here is it different?

Secondly, it says in Parshas Naso that Klal Yisrael did as they were told. We don't find that elsewhere in Torah. It doesn't say

command the Jewish people not to eat nevaila, and they obeyed. Why here does it say it **כן יעשו כן, בני ישראל בני ישראל**.

The Satmar Rebbe answers with a Medrash in Eicha that differentiates between the lashon of Geirushin and Sheluchin, each meaning sending someone away. Le'gareish to send a person away, such a person is being sent away because he should not be here. Where he is going is not the issue; he doesn't belong here, so le'gareish we send him away. HKB"H tells Moshe Rabbeinu that Pharoh will send you out, with a lashon of gareish. Pharoh doesn't care where you are going, he just wants you out of Mitzrayim. On the other hand, the lashon li'shalaiach is to send someone with a purpose to arrive at a destination. You send someone because you want to get him to the place where he is going.

When HKB"H sent the Jewish people to

galus, you might think it is a Geirushin that he is just sending them out of Eretz Yisrael because we no longer deserve it, but it is not so; it is also a Shiluach. Wherever a Jew goes in galus, it is for a purpose of tikkun ha'olam. Wherever a Jew goes, he has something to accomplish.

The Metzora would think li'garaish, that he is chased out of the machane and doesn't deserve to be part of it, so the Torah says tell the Jewish people that he is going on a shlichus. Klal Yisrael needs those who go out to accomplish something. Let Klal Yisrael send him. They tell the Metzora to go, but go with a purpose. The pasuk says the double lashon **כן יעשו בני ישראל**, the first refers to the senders, to Klal Yisrael to give chizuk to those who are being sent, and then also for those who were sent with a purpose.
