DVAR TORAH

The Ramban in pasuk 25:24 discusses the purpose of the Shulchan. When Elisha conveys the blessing to the Isha Hashunamis that her oil will be multiplied, he asks her what she has in the house, and she responds a little bit of oil. He then instructs her to take as many keilim as possible into the house ahead of

time, and to then lock the doors. Miraculously, the little bit of oil she poured continued to flow until all the keilim were filled. The lesson gleaned is the notion that a miracle comes after a little bit is given at the outset. From that small amount of oil, she was able continuously pour without stopping. Beracha comes when there is something upon which it could be chal. The question is why should it be that way? Does G-d need a little bit of oil to create a miracle? Why is that the way in which miracles happen?

Says the Ramban, the bread placed on the Shulchan was the source and the foundation of beracha for Klal Yisrael. After the days of creation where Hashem created yeish mei'ayin, one of the conditions for the continuity of the briya is that never during the years of olam hazeh would there again be yeish mei'ayin. You need something from which it begins.

Before the cheat of Adam and Chava, Gan Eden itself was a place that had a beracha of yeish mei'yeish -- from a little bit came a lot. If you had a jug with a little oil, you would pour from it and pour forever. This is the blessing of Gan Eden, and this is a beracha we see from a tiny seed. A seed could be planted in the ground and from that seed sprouts a tremendous tree, a tree that gives forth many peiros for an extended period of time. That seed is this idea of Gan Eden Kodem Ha'cheit. A shefa of beracha that just needs a little bit upon which to be chal.

The Mishkan was a Gan Eden in this world; it was a place of Adam HaRishon Kodem Hacheit and to that degree, a small amount of bread placed on the Shulchan brings forth a ribui of beracha for Klal Yisrael. The Magen Avraham says that when a person says Birchas Hamazon at his own table, he should leave some bread on the table on which the beracha would be chal. The miracle of Adam HaRishon Kodem Hacheit is such that from a little bit comes a tremendous shefa of beracha.

Rav Hutner in Pachad Yitzchak adds to this idea and says that in ruchnios, the blessing of Gan Eden remains. Chazal say for example adam mikadeish atzmo l'mata m'at mikadshim oso milmala harbei, or the expression pischu li pesach k'pischei shel machat v'ani eftach lachem pesach k'pischei shel ulam. There is an idea that in olam hazeh when a person starts something spiritual, there is a shefa of beracha and a ribui that comes with it. One who learns with the right attitude or does mitzvos with the right approach is privileged to that shefa of beracha where a person achieves more than he ever thought he could in the first place. If we give a little of ourselves in ruchnios, the beracha we receive can ultimately lead to seemingly unimaginable accomplishments.
