When Yehuda is born, the words Leah Imeinu recites in 29:35 are 'ha'paam odeh es Hashem,' today I will thank Hashem and as such, calls the child Yehuda. Rashi asks why does Leah now thank Hashem as opposed to any other birth of the Shivtei Ka? Rashi answers Leah took more than the portion that she deserved and because of that, she gives praise and thanks to HKBH.

The Pachad Yitzchak on Chanuka imparts a beautiful understanding as to the midda of Hakaras Hatov generally, and particularly the Hakaras Hatov we should have for G-d. There are two components to Hakaras Hatov. One component is the past, the avar -- a recognition that something that happened in the past is deserving of your thanks. The second component is the future, the present and the future. That is to say, what is Hakaras Hatov -- someone was meitiv to you in the past, a) you have to recognize that and b) you have to see it as a responsibility moving forward. In other words, to recognize what transpired in the past, and to recognize for the present and future what it is that it obligates us to act. These two components together form Hakaras Hatov. Someone who recognizes how someone else did something good for him in the past, but doesn't see it as an obligation going forward is lacking in Hakaras Hatov. Similarly, if someone wants to be meitiv in the future but doesn't recognize that he has an obligation for the past he is lacking in Hakaras Hatov - It is the two together.

Says Rav Hutner, that is why the word 'modeh' has two meanings. Modeh means

to admit (e.g. modeh b'miktzas), which is a reference to the past, and modeh as in Hallel V'hodaa which signifies praise. These are seemingly two completely different things -- to admit and to praise -- but the praise without the admission and without the recognition of what had occurred is not Hoda'a. Hoda'a is the recognition and the response.

This explains Modim in Shmoneh Esrei. We say Modim anachnu lach -- HKBH we praise you. A moment later we say nodeh l'cha u'nisaper tehilasecha al cha'yeinu ha'mesurim bi'yasecha-- we praise you. It seems to be redundant. Explains Rav Hutner, these are the two components of being makir tov. Modim anachnu lach she...li'olam va'ed, is a reference for the future. Then there is Modim Al, which refers to something that has already occurred. So, Modim Al is something that refers back in time and Modim She' refers to something forward. It is not a redundancy; we need the two. The Hoda'a and the Modim. An insight to when Leah says **הפעה אודה אתה יותר מחלוקת** to the future. Rashi says **שנוטלת יותר מחלוקת**. It is the recognition that I took more than my cheilek. One without the other is not a true Hoda'a.
