

Rashi states that bikesh Yaakov lei'shev bi'shalva -- Yakov Avinu wanted to live in serenity. Asks HKBH, is it not adequate that tzaddikim have the world to come, do they need to live in shalva in this world as well?

Rav Shimon Sofer offers an innovative p'shat. A person always has to have goals. He has to have something to strive for which has yet to be attained. A person who has achieved kol mishal'osav -- everything that he wants will be unhappy with life. He may be happy the first moment he has achieved all his goals, but if he has no goals ahead of him, that happiness will be short-lived for there is nothing more to accomplish. It is said that when Alexander conquered the world and he came to the southern coast of India, he wept because there was nothing left to conquer. Indeed, he died not long thereafter. The yesod is that people need something to look forward to. Once you have accomplished things it is dangerous not to have additional goals.

We pray to HKBH posei'ach es yadecha u'masbi'ah l'kol chai ratzon -- The simple meaning is, satisfy all living creatures with what they want. Says R' Shimon Sofer, Hashem, posei'ach es yadecha, and give every living creature, ratzon, a goal, a desire, a drive -- something for which he is headed.

Rashi should be read lo dayan li'tzadikim, it really isn't enough for tzaddikim that everything is all done and set for olam ha'ba and their goals are achieved. They need to always have a goal left to accomplish in this world until they reach shalva. Shalva should always be something just beyond one's grasp. Every Shabbos morning, we recite in the piyut of Kel Adon regarding the kochvei ha'shamayim that they are s'meichim bi'tzeisam v'sasim bi'vo'am. In his explanation as to the difference between Sason and Simcha, the GRA explains that Sason is a quick and short-lived moment of temporary joy and elation. Simcha, the higher level of the two, is a more permanent calmness of ease and tranquility. For this reason, the kochvei ha'shamayim feel Sason, that temporary sense of jubilation, bi'vo'am, when they return from already experiencing something in the past. On the other hand, Simcha, the higher level of the two, is only felt when the kochvei ha'shamayim are bi'tzeisam, when they are taking leave and are looking forward to that which they will experience and will accomplish. The yesod is person should always have something to look ahead to and have a goal to reach.
