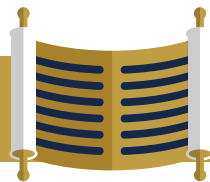

TORAH

The Pachad Yitzchak in Maamarei Pesach Siman 60 discusses the miracle of 11:7, **ולכל בני ישראל, לא, יחרץ כלב לשנו**. It seems to be a very incidental and minor benefit that when the Jews left Mitzrayim, the dogs didn't bark. Is that noteworthy given everything else that took place for Klal Yisrael -- is it an extraordinary thing that dogs didn't bark? Rav Hutner says the following. Chazal say that a dog has chutzpah. A dog is the siman of Chutzpah. When it talks about Ikvisa D'mishicha, it says 'pnei ha'dor ki'bnei ha'kelev' -- the face of the generation is like the face of a dog in that a dog has chutzpah.

What is the chutzpah of a dog? Most people will answer it is the barking and the biting of dogs that is their chutzpah. Rav Hutner says no. The chutzpah of a dog is that a dog is man's best friend. A dog sees itself as a friend to a human being. There is no other animal that has that type of a feeling towards people. It's a chutzpah. Human beings are so much more elevated. How can a dog feel to be the friend of a human being? It is only in a world that doesn't appreciate the greatness of human beings where a person could think that it is a beautiful thing that a dog is man's best friend (this isn't to say dogs aren't great; just explaining the more exalted level of man). As the Kuzari explains, there are four primary levels of creation in ascending order - domeim (inanimate objects), tzomeiach (vegetation), chai (living creatures), medaber (man) - Klal Yisrael is on an even higher level than the medaber - a fifth level,

and that is the level of banim, children of HKBH, as the pasuk says 'banim atem l'Hashem Elokeichem.'

Says Rav Hutner, the chutzpah is that the dog sees itself on the same level of human kind. That explains the metaphor that the generation of Ikvisa D'mishicha is pnei ha'dor ki'bnei ha'kelev. The chutzpah of our generation is not that people bark -- it's that people don't recognize the greatness of elders, people don't recognize the greatness of righteous people. It is that midda of the chutzpah of a Kelev. **לא יחרץ-כלב לשנו** -we are not talking about the incidental benefit that the dogs didn't bark. The dogs in Mitzrayim were the animals last to appreciate the Gadlus Ha'adam, the last to appreciate the greatness of human kind. The dogs recognized the holiness, the elevated level of the Jewish people as they left Mitzrayim. They didn't consider themselves friends or on the same level of the Jewish people, and certainly didn't bark against the Jewish people. They saw the elevated level. They had the awe of this generation, of the generation of the Yotzei Mitzrayim. **לא יחרץ-כלב לשנו** is not an incidental benefit. It is an exhibition of the fact that as the Jewish people left Mitzrayim, they were elevated to a higher level of Kedusha.
