## TORAH

The word Am (nation) is typically not one that signifies chashivus, that shows importance; rather, Bnei Yisrael is a language of chashivus. Am is a Lashon of Ma Asa L'cha Ha'am Ha'zeh, it's a somewhat derogatory language of somebody on a lower level. Rashi in Behaloscha 11:1 states the language of Am implies a derogatory or low level. However by Mattan Torah, when Klal Yisrael comes to Har Sinai the Chumash in Shemos 19:2-12 refers to Klal Yisrael with several lofty descriptions. The term Am is used to refer to Klal Yisrael at Mattan Torah on 21 occasions. It's quite unusual that Am is used so often and consistently in such a fashion. Only after Mattan Torah occurs does the Chumash revert back in 20:18 to a language of Bnei Yisrael. Says the Sheim Mishmuel, why is the word Am used for Klal Yisrael at Mattan Torah? Gaiva can be used in two different ways. As people who are arrogant that look to bolster their importance, but also people who feel unimportant and insignificant. Am is a language of people who are insignificant, and can be used in different ways as well. I am not important and I am not accomplishing. An unaccomplished people is Am, a bland name for a nation, for a people. However, within the level of Shiflus, of lowliness, there are two different ways in which a person can feel Shafeil or low. One way is that he feels low and completely accepts that he is unaccomplished. A second way is when a person feels he is missing something, he is mishtokeik, he has a desire

to climb out of his Shiflus and accomplish. Sometimes there is a hergish a person has that he is missing something. He looks at those that are accomplishing and says why can't I do that? He feels Shiflus, he feels Am. In such a case, this Shiflus is positive. One can use that feeling of incompleteness to be mishtokeik, to yearn for something greater. Klal Yisrael comes to Har Sinai, and the Torah tells us they felt like Am. With everything they had accomplished, they felt like they were missing something. Vi'higbalta es ha'Am. They wanted to jump to the top of the mountain and be mekabeil the Torah. They felt a Shiflus with a desire to reach out. Then, Moshe came down 'el ha'Am,' to people that yearned, that desired. Mattan Torah is for people that want more. Shevuos is for people who feel that yearn to do more. To come to Shavuos with a feeling of I need to connect to Mattan Torah. Those are the people who are mishtokeik. Even if they don't necessarily succeed, they still want. This is Kabbalas Hatorah. To realize that we could do more, that something is missing, to have that desire to connect. So, we come to Shevuos with that feeling of Ahavah of not having enough and wanting more, of wanting to accomplish more, of wanting to be mekabeil more. Kabbalas HaTorah occurs only when a person is ready to be a mekabeil. For that reason, we come to Kabbalas Hatorah as an Am, as a people with a desire to accomplish.
