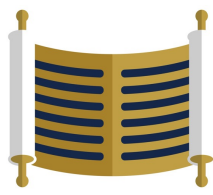

Rav Moshe Shapiro says that the lashon of Sippur, Sapeir which means to tell the story of, is related to other words that have the same shoshen; it means something which is finite, something which is limited. Mispar is a number. When you put a number to something, you state exactly what it is. It is limited to the number you give it, and makes something finite. It identifies boundaries.

A Sefer is a book, which by definition is Mugbal, limited. It carries on until a certain point. The Gemara Shabbos says if you write two letters, you are Chayuv for writing on Shabbos. But Kasav Os Achas, if you write one letter and complete a Sefer in so doing, you are also Chayuv because it is the completion of the Sefer. When someone has ideas about something, he writes it. When he completes it, he stops, and inevitably creates a Gevul for his idea. Sippur makes something finite. When you finish telling a story, a certain boundary has been created, a certain limitation on what the story may be is ascertained.

Rav Tzaddok writes if a person is Mekabeil something for himself, he should keep it to himself. When you divulge it to other people, it becomes smaller and less Chashuv. When you keep it to yourself, it is not a Sippur, it is something that is as significant as you make it. When you tell it L'sapeir, it limits the Kabbalah and makes it finite. So, how does this related to Sippur Yetzias Mitzrayim?

There is a second dimension to the idea of Mispar. While numbers make something finite, numbers in and of themselves are infinite; there is no limit to how many numbers there are. So, there is a duality to the idea of Mispar, numbers. They are finite in that it defines something. To define is to make something finite, to make something precise and limited. Yet, the Koach of numbers themselves is infinite.

Similarly, the word Taspores in Hebrew means taking a haircut. If Samech-Pei-Reish is to make something mugbal, to make it limited, so when you cut something you are limiting it. But, Taspores is not used for cutting random objects; Taspores is only for cutting hair, because hair continues to constantly grow. This duality of Taspores signifies that L'sapeir means to limit something, but only that which would inherently have no limitation and would continue to grow if left undeterred.

So, regarding Sippur, on the one you are limiting to the story being told, while on the other hand, discussing that which is infinite; there is a dimension of infinity to it.

The Malbim says there are two words for talking - L'hagid and L'sapeir. One means to repeat something old and one means to impart something new, yet both are found in the Torah regarding the night of Pesach. The Haggadah is the same every year and yet we say something new. We tell the old, but we experience a new sense of devotion and appreciation in the story we are relaying. There is L'hagid and L'sapeir. Rehash the old and convey something anew, revealing something finite yet infinite at the same time.
