Easy access wood veneer lockers on the second floor elevator lobby are sized to fit *tefillin* or a *tallit* bag and deep enough for large *seforim* and personal items. Each locker has a built-in combination lock to ensure the safety of your personal items.

The annual rental fee is \$100 per fiscal year (July 1 to June 30). Rent your locker now, and start using it for free until July 1.
