

HOW TO SET UP A PAYMENT PLAN

If you are interested in setting up a payment plan to automatically pay your membership, Building Fund, eruv, and mikveh obligations to Congregation Beth Aaron, just follow these easy steps:

- 1. Login to the Beth Aaron website, www.bethaaron.org. If you don't know your password, click on the "forgot your password" link at the bottom of the box and follow the instructions that will be emailed to you.
- 2. Once you are logged on, click on My Account
- 3. Under the list of transactions billed to your account click Submit A Payment »
- 3. Check or uncheck the items you would like to pay.
- 4. Find where the page says "Pay this amount" and choose the number of payments you would like to make. You can set up the payment plan on a weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis.



- 5. Click "continue to payment" and select whether you will pay the convenience fee.
- 6. Log into Paypal to complete setting up the plan. (If you don't have a PayPal account, you will need to create one.)
