These times are based on the expectation that Selichot will conclude about the time that the corresponding Shacharit minyan is scheduled to begin. However, depending on various factors, Selichot may end earlier than anticipated (by as much as 15 minutes), and they will be immediately followed by Shacharit. Thus, those planning to attend only Shacharit and not the Selichot that precede it may wish to arrive earlier than the normal start time for Shacharit to ensure that they will be present for the entire Shacharit.

SLOWER-PACED *SELICHOT*: The slower-paced *Selichot minyan* is designed to finish in time for the start of a *Shacharit minyan*. All who are able to do so are encouraged to attend. If you have any questions, please contact David Hes, dhes613@gmail.com.
