RETURNING TO OUR SHUL

Beth Aaron will be reopening on Sunday, September 6, with *Shacharit davening* under strict safety measures. In order to gain access to the *shul*, members will be required to sign a letter of commitment, as well as a waiver of liability. All those who choose to enter the *shul* building will be required to adhere to the guidelines detailed in my letter dated August 21.

Initially, a limited set of *minyanim* will be available. As the demand grows, additional *minyanim* will be opened. Details of a new *minyan* signup portal will be communicated shortly, which will allow members to sign up for any combination of indoor or outdoor *minyanim* for *Shacharit*, *Mincha*, and *Maariv*, on all days of the week.

While there will not be any *shiurim* or other programming taking place in the *shul* for the time being, members may remain in *shul* to learn or participate in *chavrutas*, but must comply with all of our safety requirements.

Some other items to be aware of:

- Bathrooms will be open, as will lobby sinks on both upper floors. Water fountains will remain closed.
- Please pay attention to signage indicating direction and means of entrance and exit.
- Doors will be kept open as much as possible. Please do not tamper with them.
- Once separation barriers are set up at the *bimah* in the different *minyanim*, we will return to calling people up to the Torah for *Aliyot*.
- There will be no singing at any indoor *minyan*. *Chazanim* will be following *nusach* as appropriate, but will not be engaging the *tzibbur* in group singing.

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Good Erev Shabbos,

Two topics must surely be prominent in all of our thoughts at this time - the September 6 return to shul and planning for RH/YK. Both are coming up quick, and both are not entirely clear in everyone's minds at the moment. We've received a lot of questions these past few weeks, and without taking up too much digital ink on the matter, I will try to shed a bit more light on the matters.

Returning to Shul:

Starting Sunday, September 6, Beth Aaron will resume holding minyanim inside of shul. We will begin slowly, offering two minyanim for Shacharit and one minyan for Mincha/Maariv every day of the week. Concurrent with the reopening of shul, we will be opening up a comprehensive minyan signup platform using signup.com (familiar to those of you who have signed up for and attended the Rabbi's Pirkei Avot shiurim this summer) for all Beth Aaron minyanim, indoor and outdoor. So while we introduce indoor minyanim, we will continue to sustain our outdoor minyanim as well. As the demand for indoor minyanim grows, more minyan options will be offered. But the important thing for us right now is to open up slowly and make sure we get things right, before more and more people start filling our building. When you sign up for a minyan on the new platform, you will be required to sign a waiver. Once signed up, your shul access will be reactivated on the Openpath App, and you'll be able to enter shul as you did before to attend the minyan you sign up for. Our expectation at this time is that you will arrive for minyan and leave once minyan is over. You are welcome to stay in shul after minyan to learn, but generally speaking we are trying to avoid having people linger in shul. This is for your safety as well as the safety of others. Doors will be propped open, and you should expect to see signage and traffic control markings that will guide your entry and exit from shul. This is intended to keep touch points as well as contact points to a minimum and to maintain social distancing for all those inside of our shul. We ask that you comply with those directions, even if they require you to go somewhat out of your way. You should expect to wear a mask covering both your mouth and nose, and maintain social distancing at all times while in our shul. This is an absolute requirement, and those not willing to comply with face covering and social distancing requirements will be asked to leave shul. Rooms will be set up with seats in specific locations, or in the case of the main shul with specific seats marked as usable. It is imperative that you not move any of those seats or seat markings, as they are there to ensure the safety of all those entering our building to daven. Bathrooms will be open, but we ask that you try to avoid using bathrooms unless absolutely necessary.

Because we are requiring advanced registration AND the signing of a waiver to enter shul, it is important that every single individual entering shul for minyan does so on their own. This means that there should be no piggybacking. While it runs counter to our instinct to have an open shul that allows entry to all those who want to daven with us, letting in individuals who have not agreed to our requirements, and who have not signed our waiver, and who are not traceable via our Openpath App puts the shul at risk and puts our congregants in danger. It is of the utmost importance that everyone abide by this rule.

More details will be provided this coming week as we share the minyan signup information, and provide more details of the reopening. We will also try to publish an FAQ list addressing some of the questions that continue to be posed to us by the kehillah.

RH/YK Seating

We have received close to 500 seating requests as of Thursday evening, and are now in the process of formalizing minyanim locations based upon the number of requests for each option. This is something we are doing for minyanim both indoors and outdoors. Many of you have asked why we would not share the locations of outdoor minyanim, and the answer is related to the flexibility we needed to make the above formalizations. We have been reading your comments diligently and will be addressing requests from those of you asking for particular locations either due to minyan familiarity or proximity to home as best as we can. We thank you again for your patience and understanding, and assure you we are doing our best to make sure everyone's requests are heard and addressed in the best way possible. We will be first placing the close to 500 seating requests received in the second round. We will then try to resolve seating for those who signed up for the first signup round but did not put in requests during the second signup round. Once that is done, the minyanim will be capped at the maximum capacity of the assigned location. Additional signups will then be accommodated for all locations only until those locations fill up. Seating assignments along with a seating chart of all locations will be made available as soon as everything is finalized. This year's task of arranging Yamim Noraim minyanim is unprecedented. Creating three times as many minyanim as usual, each with their own particular constraints, along with baalei tefillah, baalei keriyah, shofar blowing, is a tremendous undertaking. We thank you all for your patience, and hope to share specific details as soon as we can.

As mentioned above, seating setups in all indoor and outdoor minyanim will be configured to ensure proper social distancing and safety. They will also be set up to optimize space by placing family pods together. It is therefore imperative that you do not move any seats around even temporarily. Outdoor minyanim will be taking place rain or shine, and all minyanim indoors and outdoors will have full shofar blowing of 100 kolot.

I hope the above two descriptions help answer some of your lingering questions or concerns. As always, please feel free to reach out to me directly if you would like to discuss any questions or feedback further at president@bethaaron.org.
