Good Erev Shabbos,

Chanukah may be a week away, but we are excited to get things started early this year with the Pre-Chanukah Party via Zoom. Join the Men's Club, Sisterhood, and Youth Department this Motzaei Shabbos as they help us get into the Chanukah spirit with an amazing virtual event featuring Simcha Leiner. This will be a great opportunity for our entire Kehillah to gather together (albeit remotely) to celebrate together as we always do. We encourage all our members to attend and reconnect to each other and to the light of Chanukah through song, inspiration, entertainment, and celebration. Admission is free, but you can still sponsor the program by following the links on the event flyer. I hope to see you and your families there!

Many of you hopefully had the opportunity to read the RCBC message we shared yesterday. We share the same concerns expressed in that message for the dramatic increase in positive cases of COVID-19 in our community, and urge everyone to continue taking the same measures that have been taken over the past several months to ensure that we can continue to mitigate the risk to our community and to our Kehillah. Whether inside or outside of shul, the health and safety of our members is our number one priority. Please take the time to review the RCBC message to ensure that our entire community is on the same page as to the measures needed to realize that goal.

REMINDER: When in our shul or at any CBA outdoor minyanim or outdoor shiur, Beth Aaron guidelines must be followed:

- Maintain Social Distancing Sit in designated seating areas only Spaces marked off in Blue Tape in the Beit Midrash and Social Hall, and seats with Green Thumbs Up signs in the Main Shul. This applies for davening AND learning. Tables that have been set up for the purpose of putting down Tallis and Tefillin bags should not be moved around or used to gather around for learning.
- Masks Worn at all Times Your mask should be on before you walk into the building or outdoor minyan property. Per CDC quidelines, masks should be worn such that they:
 - Covers your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
 - Fits snugly against the sides of your face
- Minimize Contact We have set up the shul to minimize physical contact points, but when contact occurs be sure
 not to touch your face, eyes, mouth, or nose before washing hands thoroughly or using hand sanitizer. We encourage you to bring your own Siddur and Chumash to shul and to not share a Tallis. In the event that you use Shul Siddurim/Chumashim, please follow the above guideline.
- Observe Quarantine Travel from anywhere but NY, CT, PA, or DE, requires a 14 day quarantine before entering shul or attending an outdoor minyan / program. Any quarantine imposed by school or work or through contact with individuals tested positive for COVID-19 must be observed with respect to Beth Aaron as well.
