Good Erev Shabbos,

I'd like to begin this message with another review of some of the COVID related guidelines and logistics measures to make sure we are all able to support the effective and safe operation of our shul during these challenging times:

- Masks: Must be put on before entering the building or outdoor minyan property.
- Masks: Must be worn properly, covering both nose and mouth and fit securely under your chin such
 that it fits snugly against the sides of your face.
- Sneezing and Nose Blowing Indoors: If you need to blow your nose, exit the minyan and do so in the bathroom or at a washing station and not at your seat.
- Signups & Visitors: We require all minyan attendees to signup in advance. If you let a visitor into shul during the week, politely ask if they signed up. If they did not, guide them to the paper signup forms that have been set up in the lobby.
- Seating: We have gone to great lengths to arrange seating that ensures social distancing and maximization of space. Please do not move seats in the Social Hall and Beis Midrash without consulting with a Gabbai. Please be sure to sit in the Main Shul at marked seats, and in space groupings that match the size of your group.
- Chaburah/Chavrusa Learning: Be very mindful of social distancing when using the Social Hall or Beis Midrash for group learning. Tables have been put out for placement of Tallis/Tefillin during davening, and not for groups to closely gather around for learning. Seat floor markings should be used to space yourselves out during learning.




