Good Erev Shabbos.

We hope everyone is doing well dealing with the past couple of days of extreme heat. It looks like the temperature will be coming down a bit for the weekend, and we hope the rain holds off this Shabbat as well.

With summer upon us, we have begun to turn our focus towards the Yamim Noraim. Thank you to all the outdoor-goers who responded to the outdoor Yamim Noraim survey. Your input has been most helpful in the planning process. We are aiming to launch High Holiday Seating purchasing by next week with a goal of getting all seating purchases in by the end of the month to allow our seating committee sufficient time to plan around the needs of our members. While we are thankfully not expecting as difficult a challenge around seating as we had last year, there are still many nuances that need to be addressed so we appreciate your expeditious responses.

This Shabbat Morning, Youth Groups continue on the Shul Patio starting at 10:15AM. As noted in yesterday's update, children will no longer be required to wear masks at groups on the Shul Patio while seated socially distant from each other. Youth leaders will also be able to go unmasked so long as they are vaccinated or remain socially distant. If any of the unvaccinated youth need to go inside to use the bathroom or to be with their parents, they will be required to wear a mask.

As a brief reminder of our other COVID policies, as reiterated in yesterday's email:

- Masks: All unvaccinated individuals, ages 3 and up, are required to wear masks at all times when in shul, no exceptions.
- Masked Seating Areas: Where designated "mask only" areas are arranged at any of our minyanim, those choosing to sit in those areas must wear a mask and must observe social distancing. If you have any questions about those areas, please consult with the minyan Gabbai.
- **Kiddush:** Two Kiddush locations will be set up this Shabbat, indoors for vaccinated persons, and outdoors on the Shul Patio for unvaccinated persons. The Shul Patio is being set up to afford the safety of an outdoor environment with socially distant seating to those who are not vaccinated. If you or your child are unvaccinated, please enjoy kiddush on the Shul Patio.
