Good Erev Shabbos,

Hoping everyone had a meaningful and enjoyable Rosh Hashana. I wanted to share a couple of reminders as we prepare for Yom Kippur this coming week:

- **Masks are required for all non-vaccinated persons**, which includes children under 12 years old, in all davening spaces and all spaces within the shul building. Parents should pay special attention to their children to make sure they are following the shul guidelines.
- Snacks and lunch will NOT be served as part of the child care services over Yom Kippur. Parents should bring snacks and bottles of water from home if needed.

Mincha and Kabbalat Shabbat tonight will be at 5:40pm in the Beit Midrash, and 7:00pm in the Main Shul, on the Shul Patio, and at Singer. **These are the correct times**, so please disregard any times listed on the monthly calendar that conflict with these times.

Now that summer has passed, the Youth Minyan has officially returned and will be taking place in its regular location in the Beit Midrash at 9:15am.
