Daf Yomi: 5:30 p.m., *Beit Midrash* (Rabbi Mark Staum)

Mincha: 6:40 p.m., Main *Shul*, *Shul* Patio, Singer

Maariv: 7:39 p.m., Main *Shul*, *Shul* Patio

Havdalah: 7:48 p.m.

Our *shul* offers two options for bringing in the second day of *Yom Tov*, an earlier option, and a later option.

If you choose the earlier option, the *Plag Mincha/Maariv* is at **5:30 p.m.**, and one must begin the meal by **6:30 p.m.** at the latest. Under this option, the candles should be lit no earlier than **5:41 p.m.**, and they should be lit *lichvod ha-seudah* (in honor of the evening *Yom Tov* meal).

If you choose the later option, the *Zman Mincha* is at **6:40 p.m.**, with *Maariv* at **7:30 p.m.** Under this option, the earliest time to light candles and to begin any preparations for the evening meal is **7:48 p.m.**
