The son-in-law of Rabbi Yehuda Amital zt"l, Rabbi Gilad is involved in the publication of his father-in-law's writings. He is a national spokesman for the morally sensitive in the religious community and has earned recognition for his outspoken views and grassroots activism in promoting a Jewish and a democratic state, one without contradiction or coercion from the religious establishment.


