Ari and Chavi have been separated for almost five years and have been civilly divorced since October 2020. In July 2022, the Vaad Hadin V'Horaah of New City issued a psak (ruling), stating that Ari is a sarvan ladin (refusing to submit to the beit din) and that he is chayav (obligated) to issue a get to Chavi. Ari has thus far disregarded this psak and refused the beit din's directive to give Chavi a get, leaving her an agunah (chained woman). His parents have not helped to work towards a resolution. Get-refusal is a form of domestic abuse and cannot be tolerated within our community. We must make it clear to Ari and his family that his behavior is abusive and unacceptable.


