FROM THE RABBI'S DESK Liberation Season

As we approach Pesach (Passover) and the Season of Follow Rabbi Mimran's our Liberation, one of the crucial messages of this Yom Tov is that every Jew has the inner ability to transform themselves, in a short time, from one extreme to the opposite. It's been in our DNA since our ancestors acomplished this around 3350 years ago.

Our Holy Scriptures describe the bitterness of the enslavement in Egypt and the nadir of spiritual depravity to which the enslaved Jews had sunken in Egypt. Enslaved in a country from which not even a single slave could escape; completely in the power of Pharaoh; broken in body and spirit by forced labor - suddenly Pharaoh's power is broken; the entire people is liberated; and we emerge from bondage as free men, bold and dignified "with an outstretched arm" and "with great wealth"!

Likewise, after having sunk to the 49th degree of unholiness, to the point of pagan idolatry, they suddenly behold G-d revealed in His full Glory, and only a few weeks later they all stand at the foot of Mount Sinai on the highest level of holiness and prophecy, and G-d speaks to each one of them, with no intermediary, and declares: "I am G-d, thy G-d!"

No matter what the status of the Jew; no matter how gloomy the position appears to be, we must remind ourselves every day of Yetzias Mitzrayim, our exodus from Egypt - and strive towards our own complete liberation. Freedom from the shackles of our own "Egypt", through accepting the Torah and upholding the commandments. On this road; there must be no resting on one's initial accomplishments; one must go on until one apprehends and experiences the call: "I am G-d, thy G-d!"

Wishing you all a kosher and happy Pesach, and may the Prophetic promise, "as in the days of your liberation from Egypt will I show them wonders" in the form of our Mashiach, be soon fulfilled in our time.







CHARLESTON KOSHER UPDATE By Linda Kirshstein



As we are in the middle of our game, "kosher for Passover Beat the Clock," I thought I'd update everyone on kosher for Passover in Charleston.

Preface: *make sure to look for the kosher for Passover marking*

Food Lion *Savannah Hwy* has been offering the most generous array of products in Charleston, with fresh and frozen beef and chicken, deli meats, cheeses, and other frozen products as well as a dry goods section. During the year the kosher product manager, Jessica, offers to place special orders if we'd like something they don't usually carry.

Trader Joe's has fresh chicken, 1/2 turkey breast, and beef.

Publix Sam Rittenberg Blvd has a dry goods section in the front of the store.

Harris Teeter has a dry goods display back by the dairy section in both the Savannah highway and Sam Rittenberg locations.

Walmart *Bees Ferry Rd.* has a display in the aisle on the way back on the right side of the store. (Their Kedem grape juice is \$4.95 for a 64 oz bottle).

Costco *West Ashley* this year is carrying grape juice, macaroons, chocolate-covered almonds, and a few other items near the frozen salmon. They also have salami bullets, and Jack's mild Italian sausages. They are both really reasonable and are kosher for Passover.

Dining In At the time this newsletter comes out, it is too late to order for Passover, but in the past, they have had extras the day of pick up. [Kosher for Passover fried chicken orders are due April 12th. **ORDER HERE**]

Grillers Pride At the time this newsletter comes out, it is too late to order for delivery, but they might be able to ship FedEx so you could call and ask about that. Grillers Pride is a butcher based out of Atlanta, who has serviced the Charleston area and delivers fresh beef, chicken, and lamb.

The OU Guide is available at Dor Tikvah and is very helpful.

You can find kosher for Passover wines at **Trader Joe's and Total Wine**. Tropicana orange juice has been spotted Kosher for Passover. Dairy products such as butter, sour cream, cottage cheese will be coming out soon and you can find updates on the **Kosher in Charleston Facebook** page. Kosher in Charleston always has interesting finds that people have come across and posted for others in Charleston. We are also starting a **WhatsApp group** for Kosher in Charleston, so be on the lookout for that. I have to say, the Kosher in Charleston Facebook page is a pretty busy little group and it is very inspiring to see how many people care about keeping kosher.
