- 2. We will mail you a COURTESY VALET PARKING PERMIT to show to D&P Valet, who will be stationed at the Kittanning Way entrance of Temple Sinai. (Show the permit to D&P Valet each time you attend one of the applicable services.*)
- 3. Due to logistics and crowds, please note there could be a wait of up to 10 minutes to receive your car.
