Every few years, in youth group or at camp, a program will begin with everyone gathering in the dark. Each person receives a candle, but only one person has a match. In the darkened room, no

one can see anyone except, perhaps, the people right next to them. The match is struck and the first candle is lit. Now there's a little more light around that one candle. But anyone farther away can only really see the tiny flame dancing. Then that candle lights another, which lights another, which lights another. Soon, the flicker of candles fills the room, and it's not so dark anymore. The light spreads quickly when we're together.

And here we are, once again coming to the darkest time of the year, but this time without the closeness of community. Not only are the nights long and the moon just a sliver, we don't even have the opportunity to gather together to dispel the darkness. This season can be difficult during the best of times, and these are not the best of times.

Various traditions from around the Northern Hemisphere, including Judaism, offer opportunities and rituals to shed more light in the dark of winter. Our Hanukkah candles brighten our homes and our hearts alongside the other lights

that decorate our neighborhoods. We may have to be at distance from our friends and family, but we can still share our light.

We're offering a number of special online gatherings this Hanukkah to give us all a chance to celebrate with our community from the comfort and safety of our own homes.

Join us for readings of favorite Hanukkah children's stories at 5:50 PM each night. At 6 PM on weeknights and 7 PM on Friday and Saturday, we'll light candles together. Afterwards, members of our community will share personal stories or reflections on Hanukkah. (See page 3 for more details.)

Saturday night, December 12, we will have a free online concert with Sheldon Low and Hadar Orshalimy—our gift to you. Let the light of these two wonderful, kind musicians brighten your evening. (See below for more details.)

Wednesday night, December 16, WoTS is hosting a Chag HaBanot (Festival of the Daughters) celebration, based on the North African ritual for Rosh Chodesh during Hanukkah. (See page 3 for more details.)

Don't forget to share your light with others through phone calls, letters, etc. It doesn't take much for one candle to light another, so even small touches spread the light and love quickly. May each of us enjoy the brightness and warmth of our community.

Shining Hanukkah Light on Women & Girls


