Rabbi's Reflections

I was in fifth grade, playing on a newly-renovated playground at my school, when I saw the swastika scrawled on the floor of one of the towers. My class had been reading Holocaust fiction, like Number the Stars and The Devil's Arithmetic, so it was likely a prank or a

way that a kid who didn't know how to handle the topic was acting out, but it was the first time I had seen a swastika in real life.

I was furious. I don't remember being afraid of an attack or concerned that Nazis were living in my neighborhood, but I remember feeling angry and upset that my safe space had been violated. I went straight to the teacher and, within a few days, volunteers came out to clean the playground of all graffiti. The swastika was gone, but it took at least a few more weeks before I went into any of the towers, and only with the assurance from my friends that nothing was there.

Throughout the fall and into this winter—not to mention the past couple of years—there have been increasing numbers of antisemitic¹ attacks and incidents across the US, even in heavily Jewish areas where antisemitism hasn't reared its head in decades. When things were quiet, or happening primarily in Europe, or focused mostly on Israel and its policies, we could mostly ignore the way antisemitism has seeped back into American society. Not anymore, especially not with so much violence against Jews and Jewish spaces taking place during Hanukkah, when we celebrate our triumph over those who attacked our ancestors and desecrated our holy spaces.

We can't ignore the rise in antisemitic attacks and incidents, but we also can't let fear overwhelm us. Most of the violent antisemitism in our country is stirred up by a small group of people who want our society to break down. They make fake accounts on social media and feed into our fears, pitting groups—especially Blacks and Jews—against each other. The best way to combat this trend is to engage with each other. Just as my community came together, reaching out across difference helps build strong community and minimizes the success of these attempts to divide us.

Likewise, it is important to remember that we define our Judaism—not other people. At Temple Sinai and in the Greater Pittsburgh Jewish community, Judaism is our strength, our inspiration, and our joy. Let us continue to live our Judaism fully and share its blessings.

When your child is comfortable, you are comfortable. When your child cries, you cry. When your child laughs, you laugh. From the early days when I would bring our son as an infant and toddler, he would relax and explore, and then through his trying teens and now as he continues to grow as a young adult— Temple Sinai is the space of freedom, expression, and love; for our son, our parents, and us.

My father was often in the hospital. He always took comfort when his Rabbi would visit. At his previous synagogue, those visits waned away. I felt sad for him and convinced him to come to services at Temple Sinai. You could see the warmth in his face. He joked that he even



listened to the sermon that night. He and my mother joined almost instantly. A few weeks later found him in the hospital again. And not 24 hours later, my father had his first visit by Rabbi Jamie. That sealed the deal for the rest of his life, my mother's life, and now ours and our son's.

With the introduction of the Life & Legacy pledge, we saw this as the perfect way for us to tell Temple Sinai how much a part of our lives and the lives of our family, it has always been and now, always will be. From our son's naming and bris, to my Bat Mitzvah and his, to our wedding, and my parents' funerals, Temple Sinai has been there. Has been there for the rituals and the support; the hugs and tears; the laughter and the joy. Now we can always be there for Temple Sinai in perpetuity.

"Look for me in the people I've known or loved, and if you cannot give me away, at least let me live in your eyes...So, when all that's left of me is love, give me away."

This is how we feel about Temple Sinai.

For the past 15 years, Rabbi Crystal has had a distinguished career in the role of interim rabbi. In his capacity as an interim rabbi, Rabbi Crystal has worked in a variety of synagogues around the country, including several large congregations in Cherry Hill, New Jersey, Omaha, Nebraska, and Madison, Wisconsin.
