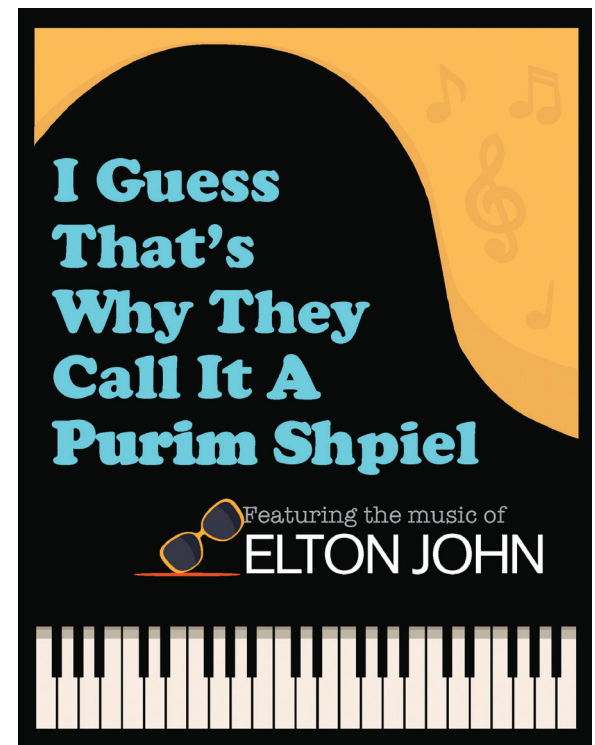

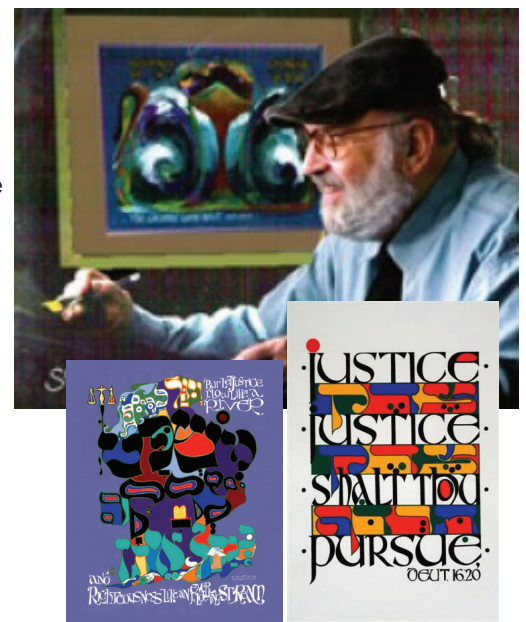
ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE MORDECHAI ROSENSTEIN

Join us for a congregational Shabbat dinner. Stay after dinner for our Shabbat Evening Service led by our NextDOR 3rd & 4th Graders.

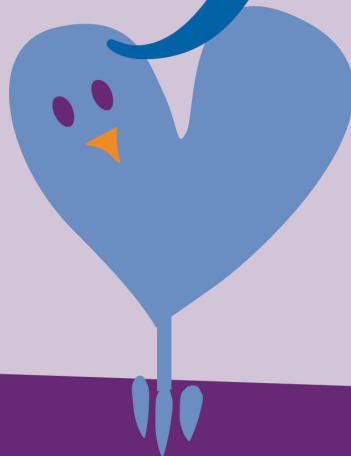
