

## **MESSAGE FROM OUR NEW BOARD PRESIDENT**

We won't complete that work in two years, but I believe it's our duty to this wonderful congregation of ours, and to the Jewish people, to begin it.




## **FALK LIBRARY NEWS**

"Violins of Hope," an exhibit of violins played by Jewish musicians during the Holocaust is coming to Pittsburgh. It will be open, free to the public, from Oct. 7 to Nov. 21, at the Posner Center on the Carnegie-Mellon University campus. "Violins of Hope" is a project demonstrating humanity's amazing ability to rebound from its darkest hour and is supported by the Diskin Cultural Endowment Fund of the Jewish Federation Foundation.

In honor of this exhibit, the Violins of Hope Pittsburgh Committee has gifted the Falk Library with the book "Violins of Hope: Violins of the Holocaust—Instruments of Hope and Liberation in Mankind's Darkest Hour" by James A. Grymes. Grymes, a professor of musicology at the University of North Carolina—Charlotte, introduces us to Amnon Weinstein, an Israeli luthier (maker of violins), who collects and restores violins from relatives of Holocaust victims.

The Falk Library has also added to our collection "Violins and Hope, From the Holocaust to Symphony Hall" by Daniel Levin, a beautiful visual documentation of these artifacts. It can be found on the reference shelf in the library.
