**Rabbi's Corner** By Rabbi Keren Gorban

Back in December I had the opportunity to travel to Israel with a group of 20 Pittsburgh-area couples. I served as the rabbi and de facto staff person on this trip that was a partnership between

our Jewish Federation and an organization called Honeymoon Israel.

For most of the people in the group, this was their first trip to Israel; none of the couples had ever been there together. And while going to Israel added a level of Jewish connection and religious interest, Honeymoon Israel ultimately wants to kick-start Jewish engagement and the building of Jewish community for young couples.

One of the aspects of the trip that continues to stand out for me was a lecture on our first Shabbat. Avraham Infeld, who sits on the board of Honeymoon Israel and is the President Emeritus of Hillel International, spoke about Jewish unity. His thesis is that Jews will never have uniform beliefs or practices but that each Jew can uphold a "table" of meaningful Jewish identity with at least three of five "legs." This also means that, even though Jews are not uniform, we can be unified because we will always share at least one leg with any other Jew.

For Infeld, the five legs of this Jewish table are 1) memory, 2) family, 3) Mt. Sinai, 4) Israel (land and state), and 5) Hebrew.

- Memory is the intersection of history and meaning, specifically the way we interpret our personal and communal past to guide our present and future.
- 2. Family refers to the special kinship among those who are part of the Jewish community. It's important to note that Infeld takes a broad view of family and includes those who have attached themselves to the Jewish community, regardless of religious beliefs or practices.

- 3. Mt. Sinai symbolizes the sense of relationship between Jews and God and affirms that such a relationship includes commitments and obligations.
- 4. Israel, land and/or state: An appreciation for or relationship with the Land of Israel emphasizes the historical experience of Jews in the Promised Land. A love or connection with the State of Israel highlights the contemporary right to Jewish sovereignty and the establishment of a place where Jews belong. It does not require agreeing with the government or its policies. Some people may connect with either land or state; others may connect with both.
- 5. Hebrew is the primary language of Jewish culture and forms the basis of other Jewish languages. It expresses the richness of Judaism in ways that the vernacular can't.

By the time you read this, it will be around two months since I heard Infeld share this framework, and I'm still thinking about it. I find it compelling and challenging. It's open to different values and priorities, and I wonder if it provides enough definition for strong identity. I appreciate that it allows us to focus on the positives—who we are and where we have common ground—and I wonder where it leaves people who only connect with one or two legs. There are also elements of his explanations of each leg that I love (feel free to ask me about them!), and I'm still wondering which five pillars I would pick if I developed this framework.

Even with all these thoughts still swirling around my mind, and even though I'm not completely convinced by Infeld's Five-Legged Table, it's a good place to start. So what legs hold up your table? And what do you need in order to keep them sturdy?

Don't forget—we at Temple Sinai are here to help you build, support, and maintain your Jewish table!

# SCHOLAR-IN-RESIDENCE WEEKEND, FEB. 15-17

Our 2019 Scholar in Residence sponsored by the Pamela K. Wiles Fund for Interfaith Understanding is Rabbi Lisa Grushcow, an expert in human sexuality and inclusion.

Rabbi Grushcow is the author of Writing the Wayward Wife: Rabbinic Interpretations of Sotah, and the editor of The Sacred Encounter: Jewish Perspectives on Sexuality. She is a contributor to The Torah: A Women's Commentary and the Torah Treasures videos for children, and is a regular columnist with the Canadian Jewish News.

Rabbi Grushcow received her B.A. from McGill University in 1996. She was then named a Rhodes Scholar and spent three years at Oxford University, where she earned a master's degree in Judaism and Christianity in the Greco-Roman World, and then a doctorate. She was ordained a rabbi in 2003 at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York City, where she studied as a Wexner Graduate Fellow. Upon graduation, Rabbi Grushcow joined Congregation Rodeph Sholom in New York City, where she served as Associate Rabbi. She held this position until July 1, 2012 when she assumed the role of Senior Rabbi at Temple Emanu-El-Beth Sholom in Montreal.
