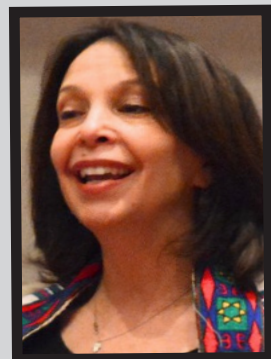


CHAI LIGHTS

What's the deal with Shavuot? As important a holiday as Passover, it is frequently overlooked. But Shavuot offers much to celebrate. A time of pure joy -- with no sad undertones -- and of dairy foods like blintz souffle

and cheesecake, it is all delight!

A commemoration of the gift of Torah, it is a festival of learning and understanding.

Every time we read Torah, we frame our reading with b'rachot, blessings. An honoree is called for an aliyah, an ascent, to the bimah, which can be understood both in a physical and a spiritual sense.

The words proclaim:

Baruch Atah, Adonai, Eloheinu Melech haolam... notein haTorah.

Praiseworthy are You, God, Sovereign of Universe, ...who gives the Torah.

Invariably I ask students, to whom are we speaking? Of course, to the Divine.

"I can do this directly?" Absolutely! Judaism requires no "middle manager" to relate our message to the Sovereign of the Universe. We each have the incredible privilege and the awesome responsibility of doing this ourselves.

Looking again at the words of the b'racha, the verb is not past tense -- it is not "who gave the Torah" years ago at Sinai -- but rather it is present tense. The gift of Torah - of discovering and challenging and exchanging its wisdom -- is always current and present. It is for each of us every day, and it is up to each of us to determine whether and how to receive, to embrace, and to transmit this gift.

Mo'adim l'simcha - to the seasons of our joy!

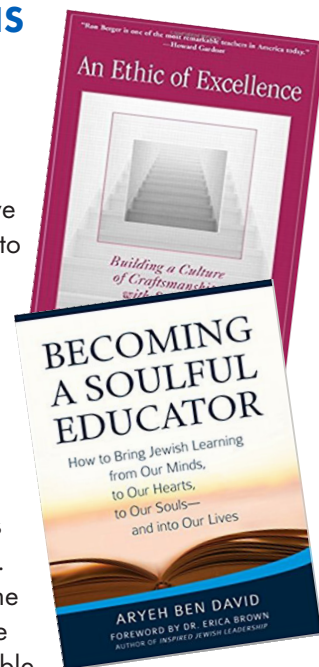

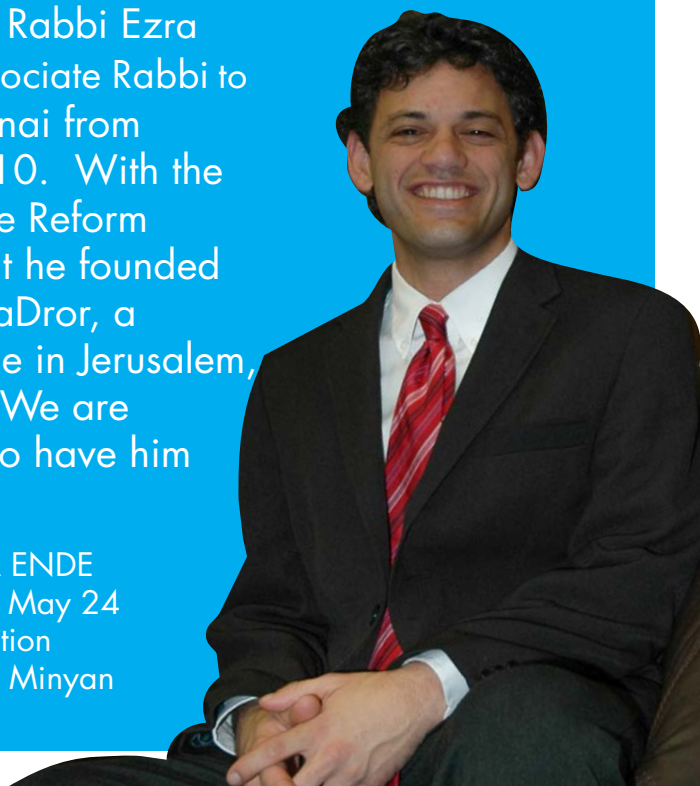
Of the two particularly powerful books, *Becoming a Soulful Educator* by Aryeh Ben David, reminded me of the importance of integrating the intellectual process of learning with the spiritual/emotional process of finding meaning in life and one's place in the world. While this sort of integration of the head with the heart is important in all learning settings, it is especially the task of a religious program to invite students to explore their hearts and souls. The other, *An Ethic of Excellence* by Ron Berger, showed me that schools don't have to look a certain way in order to be effective learning environments and that students are capable of learning and doing amazing things when given the framework and tools to do so. The stories that Berger shared inspired the new Next DOR learning program, and I'm looking forward to bringing these ideas to life for our students.

MEET EVA BLUM, MEMBER SINCE 1986

Eva Blum has lived a life full of firsts. The retired PNC executive is a first-generation American, the daughter of immigrants Harry and Jeannette Tansky who came to Pittsburgh from Russia and Poland. Eva grew up in the East End and graduated from Peabody High School. She was among the first generation in her family to earn a college degree. Blum said her parents, who had their own educations stalled by the Great Depression, instilled the importance of learning in their three children from an early age.

She took their passion to heart, graduating from high school a year early, moving on to the University of Pittsburgh (Pitt), working as a guide at the Cathedral of Learning's Nationality Rooms, and winning a full scholarship to the university's law school.

"We didn't have a lot growing up, but my parents always stressed that we had a responsibility to help others who had less. When I won that scholarship, I knew from that day forward that I had a

responsibility to help other students. That law degree opened doors for me that I never dreamed were possible," Blum said.

She began her professional career as a lawyer with the Department of Commerce in Washington before returning to Pittsburgh, where she raised her daughter, Hannah, as she moved up the ranks at PNC. The last chapter of her exceedingly accomplished professional life was as executive vice president and director of community affairs for PNC and president of the PNC Foundation.

As a community leader, Eva spent countless hours volunteering at Pitt. She was president of the Pitt Alumni Association, and co-chaired the final stage of the university's successful \$2 billion capital fund campaign. She is now the first woman to chair the University of Pittsburgh's board of trustees in 230 years.

A high energy, petite powerhouse, Eva counts golf, cooking and reading



among her pastimes.

A longstanding and valued member of the Temple, Eva believes the future of Temple Sinai is very important, both now and into the future. She states, "The Temple is a significant institution in both the Jewish and general communities. One of its hallmarks is the warm and welcoming atmosphere that the congregation engenders. This starts with Rabbi Gibson. It is my pleasure to support the fine work being done at Temple Sinai."



WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO SUSTAIN OUR SACRED COMMUNITY?

Recent public press and ChaiLights articles addressed how Temple Sinai's new Pledge 2017 will support our sacred community. Under this program, we've replaced traditional dues and the uncomfortable adjustment process with a personal pledge program. Congregants are asked to make a pledge – the best that you can – that reflects your commitment to sustaining Temple Sinai.

When you make your pledge, we will transparently share the "Sustaining Number" – a reasonable estimate of the amount it takes per congregant household to cover our costs, to sustain Temple Sinai. You can use this number to help guide you in setting your own personal pledge.

The Sustaining Number is determined each year during our budgeting cycle. In order to determine that number, the

cost to run Temple Sinai – clergy, staff, programming, building expenses and administration are estimated for the coming year. (For example, the total expenses for the 2015-16 year was approximately \$1.9 million.) These costs are then reduced by school, b'nei mitzvah, and confirmation fees, and a reasonable contribution from our Endowment Fund. The remaining amount, divided by the number of households in our congregation, is the Sustaining Number.

We want people to give to Temple with a full understanding of how much it really costs to provide the type of community we are and want to deliver.

We understand as a community that some congregants will pledge the sustaining amount, some will pledge less and still others pledge more and participate in our pillars program. Regardless we know that our congregants will pledge the best that they can to support each other and our community.

We hope that those who have paid dues in the past will continue to provide generously and with a clear understanding of what it really costs to sustain Temple Sinai, so they can make their pledge with that context and perspective.

FULL DISCLOSURE

You can expect the Sustaining Number to be about what a full dues family membership would be. In addition, we will continue to have a Capital Fund assessment to support our beautiful, but aging building.

To further help you plan your financial commitments to Temple Sinai, these are other amounts you may be asked to consider from time to time, in addition to your personal pledge and Capital Fund assessment:

- Contributions to various Temple funds (eg: Garden, Library, Book, Pulpit Flower, Memorial Plaque, etc.) include voluntary contributions, for example at the time of a life-cycle event or in memory or honor of a family member or friend
- Annual Fundraiser – a major event to celebrate an individual, milestone or activity and where the majority of the funds help offset operating costs,
 - Various optional programs that include food – eg: Shabbat meals, Sunday Brotherhood brunches
 - Auxilliary Dues and Special Programs –including WOTS dues and WOTS and Brotherhood programs specifically to raise money for Temple
 - Endowment Fund donations – voluntary gifts to grow our endowment, a contribution from which is used to offset significant operating expenses each year
