Pride Shabbat Evening Service, Friday, May 31, 7 PM



The Mezuzah in the Madonna's Foot by Trudi Alexy (Donated by Barbara & Larry Shuman.)



The author and her family fled Prague for Barcelona at the outbreak of WWII. There they lived as secret Jews until they immigrated to the US in 1941. Her life-changing experience prompted Alexy to create this multidimensional look at Judaism and Spain during Medieval times through World War II when Jews surprisingly found asylum from the Holocaust in Franco's Fascist regime.


