We tried something new in Religious School this year. We experimented, and like most experiments, we didn't know at the beginning of the year whether or not we would have success. Our experiment was moving 8th and 9th grade Religious School from Sunday morning to Wednesday night, but the timing was only a small part of what made this class different. This new class is called haSicha – The Conversation, and it represents a shift in how to approach Jewish learning for our teens. This class was meant to be more back and forth between teachers and students, and between students themselves. It was meant to be a conversation about our values, our identities, and our responsibilities to the world.



Our curriculum involved a weekly "dinner talk" topic suggested by the students. The topics ranged from the weekly Torah portion, current events in Israel, anti-Semitism, Jewish food, the history of Reform Judaism, LGBT rights, and what being Jewish means to you.

After dinner talk, we followed a curriculum based around tzedakah, and the idea that giving tzedakah means participating in the work of repairing the world. While "philanthropy" is the word most associated with charitable giving, the Hebrew word tzedakah means "justice." We give tzedakah, and we do the work of tzedakah because we are pursuing justice in our world.

The class started with a fund of \$1,500, which they had to choose how to disburse. Our class learned about the Jewish values around tzedakah, and then had to choose an area to focus our giving on. The class decided to search for organizations which increased educational opportunities for underserved populations.

This meant learning about different types of non-profits, what makes a good and effective non-profit, and how non-profits get funded. Eventually the class chose 7 organizations to invite to apply for the inaugural KKBE haSicha Tzedakah Fund grant, and we met with representatives from several organizations. Ultimately the class chose to give a \$1,500 grant to ChuckTown Squash Scholars, a wonderful organization that teaches study skills and self-confidence, and offers mentorship through the sport of squash. ChuckTown Squash Scholars is a partner with the College of Charleston, and we are proud to be part of their ongoing work.

Since our 8th and 9th graders are together in this class, the curriculum will rotate every other year. This fall, our haSicha conversation will be on Interfaith and Interreligious Dialogue. We'll be learning about other religions, and building relationships between houses of worship. As part of this class, we'll be taking our first ever 8th and 9th grade trip to New York City from March 31st to April 3rd. We'll experience the diverse Jewish world that NYC has to offer, and learn about Jewish identity and evolution from the past and into the future.

Our experiment was a success, thanks to the engaged participation of our 8th and 9th graders, the hard work of their teachers, and the many guests who helped make our class possible.

So if you're going into 8th or 9th grade in the fall, mark your calendars, and I hope you'll join me and the haSicha conversation in New York City from March 31st to April 3rd.

# President's Message

The time has come. For years, we have looked nervously at the ceiling of the sanctuary, hoping we will not be the one on whom a wayward piece of plaster falls. Some view the condition of our ceiling as a safety issue; some view it as an embarrassing sign that we have not cared appropriately for our home; and some have turned it into a game to distract and pass time while sitting in the sanctuary (I won't name any names). All agree, however, that the situation has to be addressed, and repairs have to be made.



I am pleased to share that one of the goals set by your Board of Trustees at our Board Retreat in May was that by the end of this fiscal year, we will have a plan in place for the restoration of our historic sanctuary, and a path forward to pay for it. Make no mistake – this is going to be a big job. It will cost about a million dollars, and it will take months to complete. We will be inconvenienced for a time while we are unable to worship in our historic sanctuary. It will take a lot of money, a lot of hard work, and a lot of patience to complete.

It will be a long journey, but we are taking a first step. A group is being formed to study exactly what needs to be done. While the ceiling is being repaired, there are some other renovations we'd like to make to the sanctuary, and this group will consult with congregants and consultants to determine the precise scope of work to be undertaken. They will work with contractors to solicit bids and make recommendations to the Board, and they will remain engaged as the work takes place.

Working with our Development Group, some of the Sanctuary Restoration team will work on planning and executing a blueprint for funding the work. I am not saying that the work will be done by the end of this year, and I cannot even say that we will have all of the necessary funds in place by this time next year, but I can say with confidence that we are moving forward with the work, and we will have a plan to complete it.

If this is an area of passion for you, I invite you to contact Melissa Sigmond and volunteer to be a part of this team. If you are asked for help, I hope you will agree to do whatever you can to contribute to this project. The road is long, and we cannot yet see the end in sight, but we have taken our first steps, and the journey has begun.



However, while most are at leisure and play from Memorial Day right through Labor Day for the staff here at KKBE, summer is time to prepare for the forthcoming High Holy Days, Sukkot, the second annual Lowcountry Nosh Food and Heritage Festival right through Hanukkah.

Of course the end of May also brings to Charleston, Piccolo Spoleto, which kicks-off Friday, May 27<sup>th</sup>. And once again KKBE host a series of musical programs for the "World of Jewish Culture" series, These events include:

Chamber Music with Yuriy Bekker, Natalia Khoma, and Andrew Armstrong: Enjoy an evening of intimate chamber music by Jewish composers in the beautiful and historic KKBE Synagogue. Charleston's own, Yuriy Bekker (violin), together with renowned pianist, Andrew Armstrong, will perform selected works by Copland and Korngold. The duo will also play a new composition by up-and-coming composer, Jeremiah Klarman. Beloved local cellist, Natalia Khoma, will then join for a performance of the lush and epic Piano Trio in C minor by Mendelssohn. Sunday, June 5, 6pm.
