Hineini—here I am.

On Rosh HaShanah, as we once again read from our Torah the account known as the *Akedah*, the Binding of Isaac, we will hear God call to our patriarch: "Avraham!" And then we hear Abraham's reply: "*Hineini*"—here I am. As students of Torah, our first question must be, "why does Abraham use this particular word, *hineini*, to answer God?" In Modern Hebrew, we can simply answer *ani* po—I am here. But God isn't just looking for Abraham in the backyard. God isn't taking attendance in class. God is calling Abraham to a task; God is about to test Abraham's faith—this is a meaningful call that requires a meaningful answer.

We encounter the word *hineini* throughout the Days of Awe. Its purpose, I think, is to convey a sense of *meaningful* presence.

As Rosh HaShanah begins, the prayer leader stands before God at the open ark for a special liturgical moment, a moment that proceeds the entirety of the High Holy Day worship experience. On Erev Rosh HaShanah, for the first time in my rabbinate, I was the leader with the privilege and responsibility of saying the traditional "hin'ni"—"here I am." As our High Holy Day machzor teaches, this word reflects the humility and self-awareness necessary for approaching God during the Days of Awe and for the task of cheshbon hanefesh (taking account of one's soul). And for me, your rabbi, I pray that in this sacred moment of reverence, I begin to fulfill my holy responsibility of leading our kehal kodesh, our holy congregation, through this holy season.

Soon enough, we will gather to welcome the new year 5783, confess our wrongdoings, and pray for a good and sweet future. Each member of our community will have the opportunity to say "hineini"—here I am, ready to engage in the sacred work of these holy days. What does it mean for each of us to say hineini during this season?

It might mean we are standing humbly before God, prepared to encounter the Holy One. It might mean we are turning inward, willing to be introspective and honest with ourselves. It might mean we are present with our loved ones and community, supported and inspired by those around us.

Saying "hineini" is an individual act, a deeply personal statement. And yet, we do not observe these High Holy Days alone, in a vacuum. They are meant to be marked with congregational community. We pray together, we sing together, we contemplate together, we confess together, we mourn together, we celebrate together. What might it mean, then, to say "hineinu"—we are here, together?

It might mean we are supporting our beloved congregation with our time, talents, and resources, ensuring Rockdale Temple thrives for another 200 years. It might mean we are embracing new faces and deepening relationships with those we already know, ensuring Rockdale Temple continues as a congregation in which people feel seen and valued.

It might mean we are showing up, as well as finding new ways to get involved in services, programs, classes, and events, ensuring Rockdale Temple grows as a *beit t'filah* (house of prayer), *beit midrash* (house of learning), and *beit k'nesset* (house of gathering).

As we each prepare to say *hineini*, to be meaningfully present during these High Holy Days, I invite you to consider what saying *hineini* means to you. And please feel welcome and encouraged to share with all of us how we might say *hineinu*—we are here, as a Rockdale Temple family, a sacred congregation.

I look forward to sharing these High Holy Days with our Rockdale Temple family. Sean, Seth, Becca, Sari, and I wish you and yours a very sweet, happy, healthy, and meaningful 5783!

Our senior team and leadership have spent the summer engaging in the work of reflection and thoughtful planning for the year to come. There is much to be excited about at Rockdale Temple as we begin a new year of learning and programming for all ages!

Kehal Kodesh, our religious school, began on Sunday, August 28 with our Opening Day festivities in the park, which also brought together the FoRT families, youth group participants, and more! We have a full calendar of family learning, camp-style programming, retreats and field trips (including to the Cincinnati Zoo on Parashat Noah!), youth engagement, and Shabbat gatherings.

RECAPPING A SUCCESSFUL SUMMER AT ROCKDALE

The team kept busy here once again this summer! We held a number of beautiful family Simchas, celebrated a new class of Confirmands while observing Shavuot, and observed many special Shabbats. We Rocked the Block in early July with 200 congregants in attendance. I was personally moved at our Shabbat service later in the month honoring so many of our members who have been at Rockdale for 50 or more years.

We looked inward at our operation to see where we can continue to elevate. We quite literally elevated when we changed out our chapel lights, a few of which had burnt out. As Rockdale Temple prepares to celebrate our Bicentennial in 2024, we are pleased to announce that we have launched our Bicentennial Fund. Rockdale Temple has a historic place in the development of Judaism in the United States. K.K. Bene Israel is the oldest continuous Jewish congregation west of the Allegheny Mountains and the 11th oldest congregation in America.

Through its Senior Rabbis, from Dr. Max Lilienthal to Rabbi Meredith Kahan—ten in all—the congregation has grown, changed, moved, and become a leader in Cincinnati. Just as the past Rabbis built a congregation for us and our families, we must pledge to continue that tradition into the next 200 years.

Rockdale Temple has established the Bicentennial Fund with the goal to ensure that rabbinic leadership will carry on the traditions of the past, while placing a unique stamp within the congregational family. preserve our history, maintain our goals, and act on our values. If you have already made a commitment to the campaign, thank you!





Heartfelt Tidbits (HFT) – directly helps families and children with basic and educational needs. HFT partners with several schools (Academy of World Languages and Rising Stars), and can connect volunteers to families and kids. Both of these schools serve kids who need a lot of support, including many students and families who are new to the USA.

Buddies Program: HFT will match a volunteer with a student, and the volunteer will help with homework on-line, at the school, at home, or at a nearby library.

After-School Program at Rising Stars-Carthage. We will need volunteers this fall, from 2:30–5:30pm—you can choose how often you'd like to help.

With the High Holy Days approaching, it is fitting that we at the Justice Collaborative consider our accomplishments over the past year and look forward to the future. This year, our committee resumed meeting once a month and began ramping up our planning and actions. We initially organized our work around three efforts: Gun Safety (led by Mark Michaelson), Voting Rights (led by Andi Herzig), and Criminal Justice (led by Molly Goldberg). As the year went on, we also expanded our efforts into Abortion Rights and Access (led by Emily Levinson).

By organizing our committee in this targeted way, we have been able to:

- Participate in RAC's core and campaign teams and promote their programs, including bail reform education, call-in-week for voting rights, lobbying federal legislators on voting rights, lobbying state legislators for death penalty abolition, and an educational seminar on abortion rights
- Have a Rockdale representative, Leslie Joseph, be one of two co-leaders in RAC Ohio's "Every Vote, Every Voice" voter engagement campaign
- Plan a community MLK Day online gathering
- Plan a death penalty abolition letter writing event where over a dozen letters to legislators were written
- Participate in JCRC's Gun Safety committee with leadership from Mark Michaelson and Dan Hoffheimer
- Deepen our relationship with other gun safety organizations by co-promoting their events
- Be the lead Jewish organization at Moms Demand Action's Wear Orange event for gun safety
- Promote and attend the Planned Parenthood Advocates of Ohio's rally for abortion rights
- Distribute abortion resources available from RAC and Women of Reform Judaism
- Maintain our relationship with the Ohio Valerie Weinstein

As we reflect on these efforts, we consider them in light of the points of progress and pullbacks that happened over the past year. The overturning of Roe v. Wade was a reminder that parts of society will organize to reverse the progress that we and previous generations have fought for. Meet The Congregant: Susan Klug Kahan by Linda Chatterjee

On a sunny day outside Wyoming Community Coffee, I had the opportunity to talk to our Women of Rockdale President about her life before coming to Cincinnati in 2015.

Susan Klug Kahan is a California girl, "born and raised" in San Diego. Her maternal grandfather's family had come from Sarajevo (the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina) but identified as Spanish Jews. Her mom was always full of energy, helping to run Susan's dad's medical practice and volunteering for everything in the community. After Susan's father died, her mom went to work and eventually ran her own business as a conference organizer. She was also artistic. Susan decided to combine her inherited interests in art and medicine to become a medical illustrator. One day, while standing in line to register for a science class at Stanford University, she got talking to a young man named Fred who wanted to be a doctor and that was the start of something wonderful.

After Stanford, Susan attended the University of California at San Francisco and obtained a Masters in Medical and Biological Illustration. 


