

#### A JEWISH SUMMER

As June approaches, we find ourselves "winding down" the Jewish year. Sure, 5783 won't conclude until we usher in Rosh HaShanah 5784 (it's not too early to mark your calendars—September 15–16!). But the conclusion of the Kehal Kodesh and secular school years, coupled with the arrival of Shavuot on May 25–26, our last "big" holiday of the year, signal for us the transition into the summer season. Over the summer, as kids head off to camp, adults enjoy time off, and families and friends take vacations, we take the opportunity to slow down here at Rockdale, too. The summer season allows for more free time, more relaxing days, a little extra daylight and lazy evenings—it brings a change in rhythm that for many is sorely needed. And while I love summer, too, I sometimes worry that it will slow our Jewish engagement, as well.

Though Rockdale's summer calendar may not offer as many opportunities as the spring (we hope you enjoyed the many amazing programs, events, and celebrations!), there are still plenty of ways to engage Jewishly throughout this season. We are thrilled for our teens, college students, and young adults who will travel to Israel for intensive summer trips, internships, and study. We look forward to gathering with each of our age-and-stage and affinity groups, all of whom will enjoy programs and events throughout the summer months. And of course, Shabbat continues to be our anchor in time, no matter the season—we will join together throughout the summer on Friday evenings and Saturday mornings to pray and sing, study and reflect. I look forward to spending these days of rest together in this especially restful season.

I recently read an article in a Jewish publication (interestingly titled "Jewish Secrets to Summer Success") that explained that the Hebrew word for "summer," *kayitz*, shares a root with the word for "end", *ketz* and the word for "chopping (wood)," *katzaz*. Why is that significant? The author, Rabbi Adam Simon, explained that being chopped into firewood was often the final act in the life of a tree, and that the summer holiday of Tu B'Av (Judaism's day of love—this year August 1–2) was said to be the optimal time to bring firewood to the altar in Jerusalem. Just as the firewood tree completes its purpose in the summer season, so do we complete our 5783/2022–23 programmatic year at Rockdale Temple.

To me, our formal year of programming really concludes with the weekend of June 9–11. On Friday, June 9, I look forward to the "party of the summer" with our Rockdale family at our 3rd Annual Rock the Block! We'll celebrate our year together, kick off a slower, relaxing summer, and look forward to the year ahead—our 200th year! And on Sunday, June 11, we'll celebrate the fulfillment of many of our tasks, efforts, and goals at the 199th Annual Meeting of KK Bene Israel/Rockdale Temple—please join us for brunch, conversation, and celebration at 10am. "This is what a 'Jewish Summer' is all about," says Rabbi Simon: "putting the finishing touch on all that we've done throughout the rest of the year, and coming one step closer to completion, peace, and fulfillment."



## Bene Israel Society Testimonial: SHARON NELSON AND KEN VENICK

"Creating our Jewish legacy is fulfillment of a promise and sacred responsibility to support vital ideas and institutions."

East Coast, Long Island Conservative young man meets Southern, small-town Reform young woman. That's one way to start this story. Sharon and I traveled different paths to Cincinnati. For Sharon, Cincinnati was a familiar city where with her parents and brother she would come to visit family and friends; for Ken, Cincinnati was a new city to explore while studying at UC.

It was the 1980s. Sharon had returned from Israel, where she'd lived and worked on a kibbutz, and also at Carmel Medical Center in Haifa. Moving to Cincinnati, she began her professional career at UC Medical Center. She quickly involved herself in young Jewish leadership, made lasting friends, joined Rockdale, then drifted away for a time. Ken was a cultural Jew, but not an affiliated one, moving in different social circles. Sharon's parents, Bernice and Marvin, relocated to Cincinnati in the mid-1980s. They left a small, but active, Jewish community in Williamson, West Virginia, and found a larger, welcoming Jewish community at Rockdale Temple. Both were active in Temple activities; Bernice was recognized with a Menorah Award.

In the 1990s, when Sharon and I met, I was happily drawn into her family and the Rockdale family as well. I attended Rockdale High Holy Day services with her parents and grew comfortable with Reform practice. When we decided to marry, we asked Rabbi Gary Zola, a Nelson family friend dating back to Gary's HUC student pulpit in Williamson, to perform the ceremony. Happy to do so, he asked one thing in return: that we join a congregation. And we took that request seriously, visiting several congregations, trying them on to see how we might fit. Rockdale was a good fit. Rabbi Goldman was a vibrant presence; the congregation was growing and busy; and we could join the Nelsons at Temple and in making a new Jewish home in Cincinnati.

We brought up our son, Arieh, at Rockdale: Brit Milah, Sunday School, Consecration, Bar Mitzvah, Youth Group, Confirmation. One of Rockdale's keystones is attention and commitment to social justice, a philosophy that Arieh has carried with him and made his

own. He takes his Jewish identity seriously. We like to think that comes not only from the home we created for him, but the opportunities available to him in the larger Jewish community. Arieh participated in the March of the Living, interned at the American Jewish Archives, and lived, worked, and traveled for a year in Israel. With joy we saw that these experiences made indelible and lasting markings on his character and his soul.

When we thought about creating our Jewish legacy, it was important to include organizations that have resonance for us and for Cincinnati's Jews, now and in the future. We believe in the mission of the American Jewish Archives. It is an essential national resource. The collections and the on-going research there document and keep alive the many streams

of Jewish life in America. A key piece of Cincinnati Jewish life is our cemeteries, and we included the Jewish Cemeteries of Greater Cincinnati in our bequest. They serve our local community but are also a resting place for Jews from smaller Jewish communities like the one from which Sharon's family comes. Chestnut Street Cemetery, recently rededicated, was a cornerstone of creating Jewish life in Cincinnati and is central part of Rockdale's heritage. The strength of our Cincinnati Jewish life is rooted in Rockdale Temple, also part of our bequest, the city's oldest congregation with a forward vision of open-minded Reform Judaism and our spiritual home.

For us, creating our Jewish legacy is fulfillment of a promise and sacred responsibility to support vital ideas and institutions. It is with pleasure and gratitude that we join others in creating our Jewish legacy.

## Environmental Committee



#### FROM TU B'SHEVAT TO EARTH DAY: WEEKLY GREEN TIPS

In the spirit of tikkun olam, repairing our world, the Rockdale Environmental Committee shared weekly green tips from Tu B'Shevat , the birthday of the trees, to Earth Day 2023 via Rockmail. The environmentally friendly tips are recapped below. We hope that these tips reminded you, encouraged you, and/or taught you to live mindfully so that we can collectively care for our environment and reduce our carbon footprint.

- 1. Work to reduce Styrofoam, paper and plastic plates, cups and utensils at work, home, school as well as at our beloved Rockdale Temple.
- 2. Work to conserve water by taking a short shower rather than a bath. Consider installing a low-flow shower head and faucet aerator. You'll reduce water use and save money on water bills.
- 3. BYOB! Bring your own bottles and bags. Drink from a reusable water bottle or coffee mug, and keep shopping bags in your car.
- 4. Be intentional with driving routes. Combine trips to save gas and money. Telecommute when able. Transportation is one of the biggest producers of greenhouse gases, and thus less travel is an easy way to decrease carbon released into the atmosphere. Consider a fuel-efficient vehicle such as a hybrid or electric car when you are ready for your next automobile.
- 5. Find clothing made from recycled materials, or purchase clothing made from natural fibers. Avoid petroleum-based fabrics such as nylon, polyester and fleece. Like plastic bags, petroleum fibers are non-biodegradable. The production, consumption and waste handling of synthetic fibers generates greenhouse gas emission.
- 6. In winter, wait until the inside temperature is below 68 degrees to turn on your heat. In the summer, turn on the air conditioning when the inside temperature is 78 degrees or higher. Invest in a programmable thermostat to make these changes easy.
- 7. Invest in a ceiling fan. In warm weather, run it counter-clockwise to cool. In cold weather, run it clockwise to force warm air down into the living space.
- 8. Consider cutting beef, pork, chicken and dairy intake. Animal production systems emit significantly more greenhouse gases than plant-based food systems.
- 9. Turn it off. Make it a habit to turn off the lights and electronics when leaving a room for 15 or more minutes.
- 10. Buy local to eliminate long distances traveled.
- 11. Recycle, recycle, recycle. You can recycle plastic bottles, paper, batteries, electronics, glass, textiles, metal, tires. Reduce our dependence on landfills and incinerators.
- 12. Summertime sunshine is heading our way. Avoid sunscreen with harmful chemicals and replace it with one that contains zinc oxide or titanium dioxide as active ingredients. These are safe for us and our planet.

The Environmental Committee appreciates your consideration of everyday choices that can ultimately improve our air quality and create a healthier community.


