This will be only our third year using the new High Holy Days prayer books, so in addition to signing out any borrowed books, a \$50.00 check will be required as a deposit to ensure their safe return. Prayer books for Youth will require a \$25.00 check as deposit. Checks will be safely shredded if books are returned by October 15<sup>th</sup>. Checks will be deposited if books are not returned and the Temple must purchase replacement books.

Books can be picked up at the Temple office from Monday, September 14<sup>th</sup> to Thursday, September 17<sup>th</sup> during the hours of 12:30pm to 2:30pm. Please let the office know when you'll be stopping by.

In addition to the prayer books, you may pick up your Temple calendar and the Apples & Honey fundraiser (if purchased) at this time.

## Ark Moments

This year, in conjunction with streamed services we invite Temple members the opportunity to contemplate and reflect on the past year in the sanctuary in front of the opened ark.

One of our cherished practices during the High Holy Days has been the tradition of going up to the open ark for a few moments of personal prayer and reflection on Yom Kippur afternoon. While we will make sure to offer everyone a chance to reflect in front of the open ark over Zoom on Yom Kippur as well, we know that being physically present in the sanctuary is very spiritual for some. With that in mind, private moments of reflection in front of the open ark are being made available to our members.

We have arranged for a few time blocks during which your visit to the sanctuary can take place. All you need to do is select one of the options below. We will go through all requests and assign each person or family unit a 15 minute block of time within your chosen time slot. To ensure the safety of everyone, there will be only one individual or family unit allowed in the sanctuary at a time. Face masks are required at all times. This opportunity is open to all Temple members in good standing.
