Perhaps, this year, our Chanukah narrative serves as a metaphor for this time period in which we are living. I wish I had a timeline for when we will all be able to say we have come past this, but perhaps as we stand in the deepest shadows this year, we can also take a few moments to seek out the clearest light. If we can afford ourselves a few moments to step back and reflect on what is filling us up through these challenging times, perhaps we can find the inspiration and hope that can be so lacking in such uncertainty. Know that your Or Shalom family is here for you and with you, as well, if you are having trouble finding that hope. May we open our eyes and hearts to the lights that still shine for us through the darkness, and may they help us find the welcome strength that will guide us through this season and into the brighter days that will come.

LETTER FROM THE President

The High Holy Days mark the beginning of the new year, the time to atone for our sins and start with a clean slate, and the time to start reading the Torah from the beginning. But our High Holy Days last month also began with the death of Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg.



Justice Ginsburg (or RBG) was not only a strong, wise, dedicated Justice, but she was a trailblazer in the ongoing evolution of gender equality. She will be remembered in Jewish history as a leader with unwavering tenacity. However, her life is also a reminder about the importance of friendship and community. Ruth Bader Ginsburg and Antonin Scalia could not have been more polarly opposite on their views and they opposed each other on issues that were argued in the Supreme Court. But they also shared a love for opera and were very close personal friends. This willingness to accept differences in others can be practiced by all – especially in a time when our country feels divided and many feel isolated.

Our Or Shalom High Holy Days services were shared by our community over livestream to provide a safe experience for all in this pandemic time. Our Clergy, staff, and Religion & Ritual Committee worked tirelessly to ensure that the services would be meaningful for all. There were some minor hiccups due to bandwidth and other technical blips, but we knew that was a risk when we decided to be one of few congregations to stream a live service instead of a pre-taped production. The feedback has been extremely positive so far. My personal experience was that my family felt it was very intimate and, since my father was watching from his home in Florida, I truly felt that we were enjoying services together. I hope that you also felt that you were together with both family and our Or Shalom community while praying from the comfort and safety of your own homes.

We all listened to the honest, raw, and heart-warming words that Jeffrey Metz shared with us during Rosh Hashanah services. Jeff's love for his family, friends, and our temple were palpable. We can all benefit from Jeff's example of living, loving, and laughing more often and more strongly. Our Or Shalom family came together again to grieve and to support Jeff's family only a couple of weeks ago. His family has received an overwhelming amount of support from the Or Shalom community – and this is what makes our temple community a very special spiritual home. Although we are physically separated to keep safe from the Covid-19 virus, we can feel like we are all together when it matters.

My hope for all of us is to soon be able to physically share holidays, Shabbat services, and life-cycle events with our temple family. We should be able to share programming, book clubs, social action events, and hold the first Jeffrey Metz Memorial Poker Tournament, once it is safe to do so. But until then we can enjoy being together as one community in whatever ways we can – supporting each other, laughing together, and learning together.

I am happy to share that teachers and students have "settled in" to this semester's online Jewish learning journey. If you haven't had the opportunity to "sit in" on one of your child's classes, you may be surprised to learn how many different strategies and learning modalities our teachers have been using in the one-hour sessions they have together:

Our Hebrew through Movement Team led by Morah Ricki Wovsaniker and her teen madrichot Olivia Graham and Nora Kogan, visit each kdg-5th grade class for ten minutes weekly and have children on their feet walking, running and spinning. Students are learning names for body parts and respond to commands utilizing the new Hebrew vocabulary. Hebrew through Movement is fostering an appreciation for the sounds of the Hebrew language and building Hebrew vocabulary – in addition to getting students out of their seats and moving around!

Part of each 4th-6th grade class includes small group Hebrew, as students are moved to breakout rooms to practice Hebrew with a tutor. This helps build community as students support each other's learning, in addition to improving their own Hebrew skills.

Cantorial Soloist Laurie Akers and song leader Jon Gordon visit our K-6th grade classes on Sunday mornings to share Jewish music and prayer. Laurie shares melodies and the meaning of prayers with our students on Wednesday afternoons as well.

Each week we introduce a new Hebrew letter of the week, and corresponding words of the week. We hope that you will build a "Jewish Life Vocabulary" along with your children. Each week ask them to share the Letter of the week and to teach you the new Hebrew words they've learned. We would love to share this vocabulary throughout congregation!

To help us keep track of all of our programs, schedules, emails and zoom links we are fortunate to have Michael Schneider recently join our staff (on a part-time basis) as Or Shalom's Education Coordinator. Prior to the COVID shelter-in-place, Michael was a program specialist at JCYS in Buffalo Grove where



he added Jewish enrichment to the early childhood center. His previous experience was at Makom Solel Lakeside in Highland Park as director of youth engagement and associate executive director. Michael has a Master of Arts degree in Jewish Studies and has taught at many suburban and city synagogues over the past decade. He lives in Buffalo Grove with his wife Danielle, , and their adorable children Judah (5) and Ezra (3). (shown in photo)

UPDATE

Our COVID Task Force continues to meet on a regular basis to ensure we are maintaining safety protocols in accordance with the recommended guidelines. WE'RE SO PROUD OF OUR B'NAI MITZVAH STUDENTS' MITZVAH PROJECTS!

Caden Katz: I have always cared about helping others in need, both humans and animals. It was planned for me to volunteer through JUF to help feed and serve homeless people but because of COVID-19 I was no longer able to do that, I plan to do this once it is safe. Despite that, I ended up doing two other mitzvah projects. I built a Sukkah with the help of my friends and family from scratch using fallen, found wood from my neighborhood. It is now a permanent structure in our yard and in the summer we used it as our vegetable garden. We donated some of the harvest to local food pantries as well. Second, for 4 months my dad and I nurtured the nests of a threatened native bird species called Purple Martins. We cleaned the nests and made sure no parasites were there so the babies could thrive until safe.

Megan Bernheim: For my mitzvah project, I made cards of encouragement for Rabbi Ari to give people who are struggling with illness or depression. This began when I decided to create uplifting notes for people in need during my free time. I've always loved to doodle and write – so this was fun for me. Once the pandemic hit, I was stuck at home all day during quarantine and chose to make the best of it. I had already made around 30 cards when Rabbi Ari suggested making this my mitzvah project. I agreed because I knew that I could put a smile on tons of people's faces all day every day. I was able to create so many cards given the circumstances during the time of my bat mitzvah and loved the feeling of making people happy.

Emma Zivin: Becoming a Jewish adult, especially during COVID-19, has taught me to be grateful, even in times of uncertainty and crisis. I am thankful that the worst thing that has happened to my family and me during this time has been having my service over Zoom and canceling my bat mitzvah party. I dealt with the pandemic in my own way by sewing and donating masks to Masks Now Illinois. I also sewed masks for family friends, for a small fee, and donated the profits to the family of my school's assistant principal, who died unexpectedly at the beginning of quarantine. Mask-making and my donations became my mitzvah projects, when that wasn't even my plan. It felt good to help others and to do something to help "flatten the curve."

Reece Larson: For my Bar Mitzvah project I collected items for two different military units. The first is a unit stationed in Kuwait. The second unit was stationed at an air base in Turkey. My cousin is the first officer of the unit. I sent ten boxes of items to both units. The boxes were filled with things such as Chicago Blackhawk cups and scarves, food items like Mac and Cheese, holiday decorations, and personal hygiene items they can't get while deployed. The soldiers are far away from their family and friends serving our country and I wanted them to have a little piece of home and to let them know we support them. I also spent time helping with Lake County Honor Flight. They send Veterans on an all expenses paid trip to Washington DC to visit the war memorials. I am proud to give back to them in appreciation of all they did for us.

Isabella Silverman: For my Bat Mitzvah project, I raised money for March of Dimes. March of Dimes is an important organization to my family because my older brother died when he was born prematurely in 2006. The March of Dimes funds programs of research, community services, education, and advocacy to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects, premature birth and infant mortality. Although the walk was cancelled, I walked around Del Webb in Mundelein with my family and grandfather on a beautiful day last May. I hope to be able to participate in more walks in the future and to continue to raise money for March of Dimes.

Ethan Michaels: For my mitzvah project, I collected books for Bernie's Book Bank, toiletries for PADS homeless shelter and school supplies for a local school in need. I selected these items because they mean a lot to me. I think knowledge is power and every kid should be able to learn with books and school supplies. I chose PADS because homelessness is a horrible situation. It hurts me to think about it, but I know there are so many things we could do to help. It was challenging to collect items during the pandemic. I had to bike around the neighborhood and send letters. I even helped clean out 100's of book from a neighbor's basement who could not physically move them to donate. It made me happy to perform a mitzvah. I collected so many children's book that Bernie's Book Bank sent a truck to pick them up.






