Welcome to the time of our P's ... no, not politics - this is the season in which we turn our hearts to the holidays of Purim and Passover. In one holiday, we celebrate with festive costumes and noisemakers and fun, triangle cookies. In the other, we gather with family, put together a special meal, and eat matzah for seven (or eight) days. Whether it is Purim or Passover, however, a central part of this time of year is re-telling our story.

What is this story? I'm sure you've heard the succinct description of each of these holidays: they tried to kill us, we won - let's eat! And while I always chuckle a bit at that version of the story (I'm sorry, I can't help it), there is an important richness and depth to each of these stories that our tradition demands we do not take for granted. For one, in each of these holidays, we celebrate our resilience and our survival, not as individuals who somehow escaped a terrible situation, but as a people, a Jewish people, taking brother and sister with us from the threat of harm into the freedom of a better future. Think of the story of Passover: would it be the same if one of our ancestors slipped away from her slave-owner, crossed-over the Red Sea and started a new life? No, the story is not one in which every person is looking out for oneself - it is a tale of community, taking care of one another, helping one another traverse the desert, baking bread to share on our backs, and coming into freedom together without leaving anyone behind.

Purim has similar themes - would the story have been the same if Queen Esther remained silent when told of Haman's plot to kill the Jews? Had she said, "Well, no one knows I'm Jewish, so I'll stay under the radar and survive," would her story be celebrated today? Instead, the people of Shushan gathered together and despite Esther's bravery in revealing who she was, the king was unable to change Haman's decree. Instead, he allowed the Israelites to defend themselves should those in the kingdom come to kill them and follow Haman's law. The difficult end of this story is one of Jews standing their ground side-by-side and working together as a community and a people to make sure there was a people who could survive this horrible day.

As we celebrate these holidays and the freedom and resilience and hope that they should bring to our heart (not to mention the delicious food), let us take to heart their message about the importance of being a people. Still today, we are a people – a people who have learned from our experiences and pledged ourselves to help other people in their times of oppression, disadvantage, threat or fear. In standing together for a common cause, we became an even stronger people. As you read through this Shofar, I hope that you can embrace the spirit of these holidays and find something you believe in that can help you stand with your Or Shalom people while we stand together and stand up for others. Whether it is joining our upcoming mitzvah day, the work being done in our social action committee and our brit olam organizing groups, celebrating the inspiration of music as Craig Taubman comes to our synagogue, or lifting up your community's Shabbat celebration because of your presence, may you find a way to strengthen yourself while lifting those around you, so you can feel the "P" of peoplehood.

back (OK, maybe some things haven't changed). Now I believe in putting in the work, and doing that work with others. I think about these efforts every time we start all of our board meetings, with the prayer below:

How full of blessing you are, ETERNAL ONE, our God, majesty of the Universe, who has consecrated us with Your commands, and commanded us to occupy ourselves with the needs of the community. This prayer frames the work we do together. It reminds us of why we volunteer our time; to cultivate something larger than ourselves as individuals. However, the highlight of each meeting for me has been what has come next, the sharing of our personal Jewish Journeys by all board members and staff. This has been the way we have really gotten to know one another. We are more than faces across a table working together to foster our community, we are sacred partners. We are our stories. We are history lessons. Our individual paths are the collective heritage of our people.

Someone who's life has been made better by Or Shalom, and how (and maybe even more importantly, why?). I can say that being part of the Or Shalom community has made my life better. Serving our community with an extraordinary team of sacred partners has made me a better person. The support of our congregation has made me and my family feel cherished. I will never forget this warmth and I thank you all from the bottom of my restored soul.

We will have a great day spreading "Or" (light) throughout our community and helping to make the world a better place through acts of *tikkun olam* (repairing the world) and *g'emilut chasadim* (acts of loving kindness.)



#### Many of you may not know:

Or Shalom is a dues paying member of Lake County United, a community organizing group made up of 18 local non-profit and faith based institutions. Along with our affiliates we build deep and powerful relationships in our community to target and tackle local social injustices and build a more virtuous community.



Our work flows directly from a shared commitment to the values embodied in our Abrahamic religious and democratic traditions. In the spirit of *Tikkun Olam* we work to help repair the world and safeguard those who may be at a disadvantage.

#### Here are a few recent LCU accomplishments and initiatives:

- Mental Health Facilities: Multiple LCU actions led to the approval and construction of Lake Behavioral Hospital with 46 in patient beds. The hospital is committed to accept patients regardless of their ability to pay.
- **Gun Violence:** Reducing Gun Violence through pressuring gun manufacturers to be responsible corporate citizens by making guns safer and helping reduce illegal gun sales. In addition, LCU members meet with city, county, and state politicians to help legislate for stronger safety laws.
- **Crisis Intervention Training:** Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training for our local police and first responders and the establishment of mental health crisis centers to divert mentally troubled citizens from jail or emergency rooms.
- Affordable Housing: Lake County United continues to seek ways to improve the quality of
  housing for low income and senior citizens in the county. We pushed through the development
  of Fairhaven Crossing a 40 unit affordable housing building in Mundelein as well as breaking
  ground for the new Winchester House in Libertyville for senior transitional housing and care.

**Community organizing is a powerful force for change**. Our success depends on participation of concerned citizens like you. There are many opportunities for involvement at many different levels. 
