


FROM OUR RABBI...

NOTES FROM THE CANTOR

"Do you miss performing on a stage?"

When I transitioned from a career in musical theatre to the pursuit of becoming a Cantor, I was both surprised and grateful for the number of "Broadway to Bimah" concerts that were shared at congregations around the country. For the many Cantors who had prior careers

in music, our participation in "Broadway to Bimah"

concerts are usually accompanied by questions such as

It has been nine years since I began my pursuit towards the Cantorate. It's been thirty years since I first sang professionally and discovered that music touched my soul more profoundly than anything else (the combination of peanut butter and chocolate being in second place). Through music, my path towards becoming a cantor was unveiled. Although it is beautifully challenging and fulfilling to teach, counsel, write D'vrei Torah and be a part of such an extraordinary community, I'm aware that none of it is realized completely without the pure pulse of music, my soul's heartbeat. Although my life in musical theatre inspired magical experiences and lifelong friendships, the true center of my soul's dream kept surfacing each time I sang on a bimah. It was in the setting of a sanctuary that music reached heights that transcended the pinnacle of musical theatre wonder. Something between music and words, the congregation and me, God and community flowed so freely and deeply, creating a revelatory connection. Today, it is my dream to use music to serve God and the Jewish people by communicating something ineffable, that which can sometimes only be expressed through song. Every time I sing, and every time I hear your voices, I am reminded of what caused my pulse

It's my 5th year with you at Congregation Or Shalom and I am so thankful to you for the honor of every opportunity that you have extended to me as your cantorial soloist and now, as your Cantor. I share my personal reflections with the hope that they may inspire you to meet who you "once wanted to be" with gratitude for where your journey has taken you. May you remember to find gratitude in each transition that brings you closer to who you are.

LETTER FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION

RABBI SARAH ROSENBAUM JONES

It's chilly outside, but we can feel the Or Shalom warmth at 21 Hawthorn Parkway. Since my arrival at Or Shalom in July, I have seen what a loving and energetic community we have here. Thank you for sharing your children and families with us every week.



The first half of our school year was ripe with innovation and meaningful moments. Here are some highlights from our J² program so far this year. This is just a small taste of the joy of J² this year—there is not enough room on one page (or even a whole Shofar!) to share all of our kvells. Of course, our incredible faculty and madrichol (teen aides) deserve our greatest praise, as none of this would be possible without their devotion.

- After many years of visioning and prototyping from our J² Committee, we launched our pilot of 3rd and 4th grade *derachim* (pathways). Our students are learning about this year's essential question, "How do we live Torah?" through various modalities of their choice. Last week, we saw the fruits of their first 7-week derachim and were blown away by the sophistication of their learning.
- Our new 5th-grade curriculum is centering around two primary biblical texts:
 Maccabees, which tells the story of Chanukah, and Megillat Esther, which tells the
 story we share on Purim. Our 5th graders engaged in project-based learning about
 the themes of Chanukah and created an impressive Chanukah gallery that they
 shared with our community in December. They are currently working on studying
 Esther's story and will produce and act in our Purim spiel. Join us at the Purim carnival
 on March 13 to see their production!
- Our 3rd-6th grade Hebrew learners get together weekly at Or Shalom and in over 20 small Hebrew learning groups on Zoom to expand their understanding of prayer and how to be pray-ers. Our Hebrew learners delight in the connections they make with their teachers and with each other.



- We have introduced 5 new electives in our 7th and 8th grade program this year. Our teens
 continue to learn about Mitzvot and the Holocaust as they've done in years past. This year,
 they also got to choose classes about Jewish cooking around the world, Israeli history and
 geopolitics, obscure Torah stories (Rated "T": Torah for Teens), a deeper dive into the
 Holocaust, and Tikkun Olam.
- PreK through 6th-grade families have engaged in meaningful family learning about our Living Torah Values of the Month, chosen in honor of Or Shalom's Year of Living Torah. So far we have highlighted: *Anavah* (humility), *Hoda'ah* (gratitude), *Ometz Lev* (strength of the heart), *Ba'al Tashchit* (do not waste). February brings us the value of *Chesed*, often translated as loving kindness. We love having the opportunity to menschify our world through family values education.

As we begin to plan for next year's J² programming, we are thinking carefully about ways to improve our existing programming and continuing to innovate to best serve all of our learners. We relish in the fact that we have been able to bring our learners to Or Shalom nearly every week, and we are putting energy into ensuring that this continues to be a safe space for inperson learning; The joy, the energy, and the connections that students are able to make while spending time together is invaluable for helping them develop strong Jewish identities, ties to our tradition, and to help us all feel that wonderful Or Shalominess!



BRIAN STRELITZ - JANUARY 8, 2022


