



The great rabbi Harold Kushner wrote the following poem in our Siddur Lev Shalem:



Let the rain come and wash away the ancient grudges, the bitter hatreds held and nurtured over generations.

Let the rain wash away the memory of the hurt, the neglect.

Then let the sun come out and fill the sky with rainbows.

Let the warmth of the sun heal us wherever we are broken.

Let it burn away the fog so that we can see each other clearly.

Let the warmth and brightness of the sun melt our selfishness so that we can share the joys and feel the sorrows of our neighbors.

And let the light of the sun be so strong that we will see all people as our neighbors. Let the earth, nourished by rain, bring forth flowers to surround us with beauty.

Each of these issues has broken apart families, friendships and coworkers. Our country and our own communities are splintered by disagreements. We follow the advice of the prophet Micah that we should "Love justice, act with kindness and walk humbly with God." These have served Jews from ancient time to these modern times through all the changes and problems the world has faced, and they will be here for us in these crazy, difficult times.

Let us be healed, let us see each other clearly, let us love our neighbors and let us appreciate the beauty of the world that God has given us.

May this be our prayer as we face a secular new year and a new federal government. And may we all say... Amen

Hanukkah is a celebration of miracles. The Jewish people defeated a formidable foe and, upon reclaiming the Temple, found that one day's worth of oil could provide light for the eight days needed to create a sustainable supply.

Our challenges here at BSBI are nothing compared to the struggles of the Jewish people in those times. But we cannot help finding some parallels as we watch our own minor miracle unfold. Faced with a daunting challenge to fund a capital campaign to supply heat and cooling for our building, we have seen an outpouring of support that will permit us to complete that project and create a fund to sustain us into the future. We could not be more grateful to the many people who have stepped forward in ways big and small to achieve this miraculous result. There is still time to feel the worth and satisfaction that comes with joining your fellow congregants. We have a community of which we all can and should be proud. The miracle here comes from you.

Phase I of the HVAC project is already underway, with heat to be restored to the parts of the building that have been without heat for over a year. BSBI is re-imagining Phase II, and we hope to complete the project in the Spring. Thanks to your pledges and initial donations, we will not have to borrow to fund any part of the project, which we were expecting would add to its total cost.

The Hanukkah lights remind us that even in the dark of winter, there is warmth and reason to be encouraged. Hanukkah is a joyous time and brings with it an opportunity relatively unique in recent months. It is our tradition to gather on the Temple lawn each night of Hanukkah to light the outdoor Hanukkiyah and celebrate the holiday with song. Although we must be careful to maintain safe distancing, this is one tradition that is not inhibited by the pandemic that has limited our ability to gather in person as a congregation. We know all cannot attend, but we hope to see some of you there. Hanukkah is also a time of gift-giving. Perhaps you will consider brightening the days of a friend with an unexpected call, card or gift, or lightening the load of someone in need with a holiday donation.

We wish everyone a Chag Sameach, and may you each be a source of light and joy to the world in dark days.

Shalom Chaverim- friends,

Hanukkah – the first post-biblical holiday – celebrates the Maccabees' military and spiritual victory over the Seleucid Greeks who desecrated the Temple in Jerusalem and prohibited Jewish identity and practice.

The most obvious symbol of Hanukkah is the Menorah (really Hanukkiyah) and is referred to as the Festival of Light. Hanukkah is essentially a celebration of a military victory by a small non-professional army of Jews led by the Maccabees against a might Greek Empire. Judah the Maccabee is so revered for his military prowess that there is a statue of him at West Point. While his military tactics defeated the enemy, the Chanukiah still stands out as the most obvious Hanukkah symbol.

We have, I believe, a fascination with light. Light can be interpreted in many ways. Light can supplant darkness and show us the path. We can become enlightened through education, culture, and purposeful living. A flame until it dies can keep on giving; it does not lose its strength while doing so. The Rabbis teach us that we can be like those flames giving Tzedakah. We can give and never really lose our brightness as a flame continues to shine as brightly as before it lit another, so do we.

Today, when peace treaties have been signed and there is still violence that threatens Israel, we look to Hanukkah's message of redemption as a source of hope that the forces of absolute evil will be defeated, and that the values of human freedom will prevail.

We, in our school, despite the challenges of technology, as the Maccabees did, we are persevering. Those who are learning to read our sacred language are mastering it in good fashion despite the ZOOM, and those who have been in our school are gaining a deeper understanding as to what our traditions are all about and how they can be applied to our everyday lives. On Sunday morning, we begin with Tefillah-prayer, but it's much more than just reciting the prayers in a rote manner. We take our prayers to a deeper level as to what each means to us in our everyday living, and we bring a sense of our relationship with God to all the activities in our lives, such as sport, dance, music and art.

As we pray for an end to this pandemic, may we find our strength through it to connect even deeper with our Creator and be open to all that we are learning about our spiritual selves. Our faculty of our school join Jody and me in wishing you and your loved ones a joyful Hanukkah blessed with peace.

Hanukkah, the eight day festival of lights, is one of the more joyous holidays in the Jewish calendar and has become among the more widely celebrated. It is particularly a favorite of children. It commemorates the rededication of the Second Temple in Jerusalem at the time of the Maccabean Revolt.



Unlike many Jewish holidays, Hanukkah is not mentioned in the Torah. The historical events upon which the celebration is based are recorded in Maccabees I and II, two

books contained within a later collection of writings known as the Apocrypha. If you want to learn more about why the Maccabees are not in the Torah, check out the following two websites:

MYJEWISHLEARNING.COM and JEWISHVIRTUALLIBRARY.ORG.

Please note: The Library is not accepting book donations. 



This Month in Jewish History By Rabbi Konigsburg 15 Kislev – 16 Tevet

- 22 Kislev Yahrzeit of Rabbi Louis Finkelstein one of the great leaders of the Jewish Theological Seminary
- **22 Kislev** King Christian IV of Denmark invited the Jews of Amsterdam to settle in Norway, with the guarantee of freedom of religion. 1622
- 1 Tevet A synagogue was dedicated in Madrid, Spain in 1949. The congregation had been meeting since 1917, and this was the first synagogue since the expulsion from Spain in 1492. The new Spanish Constitution was approved in 1966 and promised freedom of religion.
- **6 Tevet** Dr. Sabato Morais started a seminary to teach rabbis and teachers on this date in 1887. It had an enrollment of 8 students, one of whom was Joseph H. Hertz, who would later become the Chief Rabbi of the British Empire. It was the predecessor of the Jewish Theological Seminary.
- 11 Tevet President Lincoln promised on this date in 1861 to pass an amendment to the chaplaincy law, which only provided for Christian clergy in the military. Shortly thereafter, Rabbi Arnold Fischel became the first Jewish military chaplain. This broke down the final discrimination against Judaism in this country as a matter of creed.

IRA Assets and Qualified Charitable Distributions

BSBI would like to encourage charitable donations, to help our congregants optimize their charitable giving and to reach their charitable goals. On behalf of the Endowment Board of Trustees I would like to review some of the benefits of gifting Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) to the Endowment. The QCDs may also be used to pay Synagogue dues as well as contribute to the Hineni Society.

<u>Donation of "Qualified Charitable Distributions" (QCD)</u>
In legislation at year end 2016, Congress made permanent qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) from individual retirement accounts.

What are QCDs?

A QCD permits direct transfers to a qualified charity (or charities) totaling up to \$100,000 annually of tax-deferred IRA savings. QCDs offer advantages over taking a taxable IRA distribution and then contributing the proceeds of that distribution to a charity. That's because taxable IRA distributions must be included in adjusted gross income. Importantly, QCDs automatically satisfy required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year when the QCD is made. That's a real advantage for a charitably minded IRA owner who doesn't depend on some or all of the RMD for living expenses.

What are important things to know about QCDs?

Only individuals who've attained age 70 ½ or older on the date of distribution may make QCDs. The charitable organization must be an organization that qualifies for a charitable income tax deduction of an individual. The Beth Sholom B'nai Israel Synagogue and the BSBI Endowment qualify as such organizations The BSBI Endowment and Synagogue will be required to provide the same contribution acknowledgement to the owner of the IRA required claiming a charitable tax deduction. Failure to obtain the acknowledgement will quash the QCD. QCDs may be made from any IRA or individual retirement annuity, but not from a simplified employee pension, a simple retirement account, or an inherited IRA. Among other benefits, the use of QCDs for charity may reduce taxable income, reduce state and federal tax, reduce taxation of social security, reduce supplemental IRMMA payments to Medicare parts B and D. Individuals and couples with low as well as high incomes may benefit by contributing QCDs to charity.

Examples of using QCDs for charitable giving

There are several attractive options for the use of QCDs for charitable giving. For example one can use the QCD to pay Synagogue dues and contribute to Hineni. Another example of optimizing the use of QCD is to establish a **perpetual endowment** fund. By making a QCD donation to the Endowment of BSBI, the donor may create a \$25,000 endowment for BSBI. This endowment may be given over the course of a number of years to reach the level necessary to provide perpetual support of a \$1000 to **Hineni**. By adding to the donation annually the donor could reach a \$45,000 over a number of years. This amount would support a **perpetual Hineni donation at the \$1800** per year level. Details of further possibilities and arrangements for payment can be obtained from the Endowment members or via email noted below. Since the use of QCDs for charitable giving can have specific tax advantages the donor should consult their tax advisor prior to making a QCD contribution. Some plans require significant lead time to process the paper work, so advanced planning may be necessary.






