When are services not services?

The Yiddish American comedian Myron Cohen would tell a story of his father, an atheist who went to shul every Shabbat. When his son asked him, "Pop, you are an atheist; why are you going to shul?" the father answered, "People go to shul for many reasons. My friend Ginzberg goes to shul to talk to God. I go to shul to talk to Ginzberg."

The joke is funny because we know we are not supposed to go to shul to talk to our neighbor; we go to shul to pray to God. ... or do we?? We can probably count the times our parents would bring us to shul and tell us to sit quietly. We would have to sneak out to spend some time with our friends. But what if the real reason to be in shul was to be with

our friends? What if prayer was designed to promote our friendships?

Rabbi Harold Kushner once said that the way we talk to others when we are in shul is different than the way we talk to others at the gym, on the street and when we are working. It is true that the Amidah is recited individually, each of us standing before God to express our most ultimate concerns. But it is also true that we recite the Shema, our declaration of faith in God, together with every other person in the community at that moment. We share prayer, and the concerns in life that prayer gives expression to, with every other person in the synagogue.

This is most evident at daily minyan. Those who start and end their day together with the community in prayer have the most interesting bonds with their fellow pray-ers, with the people they attend minyan with. When we share prayers, we can also share much of what is on our minds as we head out into the day. It is not about baring our souls to others but sharing our joys and concerns. Life is more joyful when we share what makes us happy, and life is less stressful if we know that others know what concerns us. I know it is a New England thing to be self-sufficient, but Judaism teaches that we are connected as a community, and each of us must be responsible for each other. We see that most clearly at minyan, our daily connecting to what is important in our lives.

Morning or Evening Minyan is not about how much Hebrew you can read or translate. It is about how you can connect to God and to the people with whom you pray. It is not that everyone there can pray better then you; it is about them waiting for you to join them, and the minyan team, to share all that life can be and to thank God for all the blessings we enjoy, especially the blessing of good friends.

Join us at our new morning minyan. It is not about how much we know, but what we are willing to learn about ourselves and about the others surrounding us at minyan. I hope to see you there.

This Month in Jewish History By Rabbi Konigsburg 4 Tevet – 5 Shevat

6 Tevet – A seminary for the training of American Rabbis and teachers was opened in New York City by Dr. Sabato Morais in 1887. The school met at Congregation Shearith Israel. It would eventually become the Jewish Theological Seminary of America. The first class had eight students including one who would go on to become the chief rabbi of the British Empire

- 18 Tevet Yahrzeit of Abraham Joshua Heschel- important American Jewish philosopher
- **19 Tevet** The Jewish National Fund was established on this date by the 5th Zionist World Congress in Basel Switzerland in 1901
- **27 Tevet** Yahrzeit of Robert Gordis, rabbi in New York and author of many books helping to define Conservative Judaism
- **29 Tevet** Recife, Brazil fell to the Portuguese in 1654. The Jewish community had prospered under Dutch rule since 1631. Most of the Jews, after the conquest, were sent back to Holland, but 22 caught a ship to New Amsterdam and became the founders of the first Jewish community in North America.

A lot is going on at BSBI right now. In addition to being in the middle of a busy programming season, BSBI as an organization is busy moving us forward on a variety of fronts. Here are a few updates:

HVAC: This was discussed in more detail in last month's bulletin. We are currently forming a capital campaign committee and exploring what we hope/expect to be short-term financing options. We also hope to begin phase one of this project soon, which includes installing heating and cooling in the Silverstein Center and adjoining offices.

Cantor: As mentioned in my email to the congregation, Cantor Krieger has decided to retire. While he may teach part-time in the region in the future, his focus now is on his health, and we wish him a refuah schlema. The board is currently reviewing the cantor role, and we

expect to make some decisions quickly, so we can determine the next steps.

Future planning: The Medium-Term Planning Committee is coming up with a three-year projected budget along with recommendations for the board. They should be concluding their work in January. Shortly thereafter, we will begin a long-term strategic planning process. This will be a longer effort, involve many congregants, and most importantly, bringing outside perspectives and opinions on the strategic direction of BSBI. There probably has not been a planning effort any more important in the history of the congregation.

Outreach: The Education Committee along with others gathered to develop an outreach plan for activities outside the building that would appeal to families with children during the next nine or so months. Activities include reading, cooking and other activity programs throughout our area.

Website: Two years ago, we migrated our website to a platform run by a vendor named ShulCloud, which the congregation also uses for database management, the calendar, email and announcements, donation management and online event processing. At that time, the effort was essentially a "lift and shift" into one of the templates that somewhat matched our format. We believe that we'd be better served on a variety of levels by upgrading the look and refreshing the content of our site, which serves as a front door for the congregation. Also, as we engage in electronic marketing, we need a site that better supports these efforts. Look for a new look in the coming months.

Chavurot: Creating community is an important part of making our congregation a warm and welcoming one, and it is important to attracting and retaining members. The Grinspoon Foundation, through the Jewish Federation, has money available to support activities of newly formed chavurot – groups of Jewish people with a common interest that meet regularly. We've had a few discussions of facilitating the formation of some of these groups – including young families and LGBTQ chavurot. Members of these chavurot need not be BSBI members. If you're interested in forming or being part of one, please let me know.

Our grades 5-7 Judaica students, bogrim, began learning about Nevi'im (Prophets), the Jewish definition of what a prophet is and that prophets can be women as well as men. They shared prophets they knew about and ___ identified ones they want

to research further. We also cultivated an "attitude of gratitude" and learned commanded to say 100 blessings a day! They generated their 100 blessings in their own lives to see how that is possible. Try and see if you can fulfill that mitzvah.

Scholarship Opportunities for BSBI Youth

Beth Sholom B'nai Israel is fortunate to have a number of scholarships to support a broad range of activities that enhance and support Jewish activities of young people in our synagogue. These scholarships provide our youngsters with opportunities for exciting summer programs in a Jewish setting.

We offer need-based scholarships to applicants who might otherwise be unable to participate in these experiences. In addition, we offer incentive scholarships to encourage all of our young people to participate in such programs. We encourage everyone who might be interested to apply, especially those who have not previously received such support.



Our scholarships provide funding for a number of programs within the Conservative movement that offer invaluable experiences in Jewish living and education. These programs include Camp Ramah, other Jewish overnight camps, USY Summer Programs, summer courses at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and the USY Year Course in Israel.

We can also support programs outside the Conservative movement that have a daily prayer component, provide Jewish education, are governed by the laws of Shabbat and kashrut, and meet the other guidelines set by the synagogue's Scholarship Committee. These programs must offer living experiences away from home; day camp programs, for example, do not currently qualify for support. The Scholarship Committee also selects the recipients of the Cantor Israel and Irene Tabatsky Scholarship, which provides two merit-based annual awards to college undergraduates who are furthering their Jewish education. We also partner with the Federation-sponsored Hartford Passport to Israel Program.



Any temple member in good standing may apply for scholarship funding. Please get your applications in by Monday, February 10th. For those attending Camp Ramah, the camp is pushing to get all scholarship information from us as soon as possible, so we're accelerating our timetable.

The Scholarship Committee will meet soon thereafter to review all applications and make decisions. You can get a scholarship application from the synagogue office. You can also download an application form from the synagogue's web site at this link: http://www.myshul.org/resources/forms/.

Finally, I'd like to call to your attention the Jewish Federation program called "One Happy Camper," which awards grants (up to \$1,000) for first-time campers entering grades 1-12 (after camp), who attend a non-profit Jewish overnight summer camp for at least 19 consecutive days. 



Sisterhood Shabbat Service and Luncheon

On Shabbat, January 18, 2020, at 10:00 am, our Saturday morning service will be in honor of the women of Sisterhood and all that they do for BSBI. Our members will be conducting the service and sponsoring the luncheon.

In honor of the upcoming observance of Martin Luther King Day our guest speakers: David and Ann Brandwein will be sharing their experiences from the Interfaith Freedom and Justice Ride 2019, in which they retraced the footsteps of civil rights leaders in Montgomery, Birmingham and Selma, Alabama.

The idea for this trip began five years ago when David, immediate past chair of the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford's Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC), was asked by the Jewish Council for Public Affairs (JCPA) to bring a representative of the Hartford African-American community to a three-day conference in Philadelphia dedicated to building Black -Jewish relationships. Brandwein invited Rev. Stephen W. Camp, senior pastor of Faith Congregational Church in the north end of Hartford.

Then Rev. Camp invited David and men from the Jewish community to attend his church's men's club. Half a dozen Jews began attending Faith's men's club events "infrequently but regularly," Brandwein said. The idea of the trip came from these events. Members of the Jewish Federation Association of Connecticut (JFACT); the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford's Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC); the Connecticut Conference of the United Church of Christ; and Faith Congregational Church and Immanuel Congregational Church, both located in Hartford took part.

The Brandwein family were long-time members of our synagogue, and his mother was an active member of Sisterhood. Come hear David and Ann talk about this very interesting trip and its outcome.

IRA Assets and Qualified Charitable Distributions

BSBI would like to encourage charitable donations, to help our congregants optimize their charitable giving and to reach their charitable goals. On behalf of the Endowment Board of Trustees I would like to review some of the benefits of gifting Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) to the Endowment. The QCDs may also be used to pay Synagogue dues as well as contribute to the Hineni Society.

Donation of "Qualified Charitable Distributions" (QCD)

In legislation at year end 2016, Congress made permanent qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) from individual retirement accounts.

What are QCDs?

A QCD permits direct transfers to a qualified charity (or charities) totaling up to \$100,000 annually of tax-deferred IRA savings. QCDs offer advantages over taking a taxable IRA distribution and then contributing the proceeds of that distribution to a charity. That's because taxable IRA distributions must be included in adjusted gross income. Importantly, QCDs automatically satisfy required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year when the QCD is made. That's a real advantage for a charitably minded IRA owner who doesn't depend on some or all of the RMD for living expenses.

What are important things to know about QCDs?

Only individuals who've attained age 70 ½ or older on the date of distribution may make QCDs. The charitable organization must be an organization that qualifies for a charitable income tax deduction of an individual. The Beth Sholom B'nai Israel Synagogue and the BSBI Endowment qualify as such organizations The BSBI Endowment and Synagogue will be required to provide the same contribution acknowledgement to the owner of the IRA required claiming a charitable tax deduction. Failure to obtain the acknowledgement will quash the QCD. QCDs may be made from any IRA or individual retirement annuity, but not from a simplified employee pension, a simple retirement account, or an inherited IRA. Among other benefits, the use of QCDs for charity may reduce taxable income, reduce state and federal tax, reduce taxation of social security, reduce supplemental IRMMA payments to Medicare parts B and D. Individuals and couples with low as well as high incomes may benefit by contributing QCDs to charity.

Examples of using QCDs for charitable giving

There are several attractive options for the use of QCDs for charitable giving. For example one can use the QCD to pay Synagogue dues and contribute to Hineni. Another example of optimizing the use of QCD is to establish a **perpetual endowment** fund. By making a QCD donation to the Endowment of BSBI, the donor may create a \$25,000 endowment for BSBI. This endowment may be given over the course of a number of years to reach the level necessary to provide perpetual support of a \$1000 to **Hineni**. By adding to the donation annually the donor could reach a \$45,000 over a number of years. This amount would support a **perpetual Hineni donation at the \$1800** per year level. Details of further possibilities and arrangements for payment can be obtained from the Endowment members or via email noted below. Since the use of QCDs for charitable giving can have specific tax advantages the donor should consult their tax advisor prior to making a QCD contribution. Some plans require significant lead time to process the paper work, so advanced planning may be necessary.






