

Words from the President

Representatives of the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford spoke at the last two BSBI Brotherhood breakfasts. It prompted me to think more about the Federation, its role in the community and its involvement with BSBI.

Lisa Vaeth, director of the Association of Jewish Cemeteries, spoke with conviction in January about the importance of maintaining more than 30 cemeteries that no longer have organizations to care for them. The Association, funded by the Jewish Community Foundation and an allocation from the Federation, keeps the cemeteries in good order (and more).

In February, David Waren, who took over as President and CEO of the Federation less than a year ago, spoke about the power of working together. In addition to providing a very high-level overview of the Federation's allocations, he discussed the Federation as a convener which can

help local Jewish institutions solve problems together that they may not be able to tackle on their own. The Federation – through donations from people throughout the Hartford region – funds programs to help the elderly, people in need, Jewish institutions here and abroad, and Jewish engagement. The also promote relations with the larger community through the Jewish Community Relations Council and support Jewish education and leadership development through its Commission of Jewish Education and Leadership (CJEL).

What people may not realize is that BSBI benefits from the Federation. Here are a few examples:

- * The Federation provides an annual grant of \$17,000 to BSBI. This grant is unique, because synagogues typically don't receive direct Federation funding. This annual grant comes from an agreement when the Federation closed its Manchester office decades ago. We use this grant to support our school, which we subsidize to support families.
- * Through CJEL, the Federation provides training and guidance to our religious school. Led by one-time BSBI school principal, Heather Fiedler, CJEL also provides a broad range of leadership development opportunities through the Jewish Leadership Academy (JLA) (sponsored in part by BSBI members Sandy and Arnie Dashefsky).
- * The Federation coordinates the Young Emissary program. Currently, these Israeli youth come once a month and teach with our school students.

In addition, BSBI engages in Federation-led activities such as these:

- * The Federation coordinates community-wide social action efforts. Among them is a youth literacy program providing "reading buddies" to local schools. Not surprisingly, a number of BSBI members participate in this effort.
- * In keeping with its support of literacy and needy families, the Federation coordinates an annual children's book collection for participating students as well as special collections such as the recent one for families who came to Connecticut fleeing hurricane devastation in Puerto Rico. BSBI participated as collection points for both efforts.
- * The Federation also brings interesting speakers to the region, and BSBI members show up in force. Recent programs include an engaging talk about the future of Judaism by Rabbi Banay Lappe and Israeli-based journalist Rachel Delia Benaim, who covers climate change for The Weather Channel and spoke about what water shortages mean for Middle East stability.

I'd be remiss if I wrote about the Federation without mentioning a couple BSBI members who actively volunteer. (My apologies for those omitted.) Victor Bernstein is a leading fundraiser for the Federation. Risa Filkoff recently joined the board of directors, and Rabbi Konigsburg regularly participates in the Jewish Community Relations Council. Many of us believe that there is more opportunity to engage the Jewish community East of the River, particularly when it comes to outreach. I am in agreement with that sentiment. However, I believe that the Federation is making an effort, and I would like to recognize it.

The Federation co-sponsored the ADL event (along with the East-of-the-River congregations) held last fall in Glastonbury. They also are coordinating a regional gathering of local legislators that BSBI will host on March 25. I hope we can once again boast a strong turnout.

Students learned about Tu B'Shevat, particularly the laws in the Torah explaining when fruit-bearing trees can be harvested, how the age of trees is determined

> and the importance of the seven fruits and grains. They brainstormed all the wonderful things trees give us while creating a picture of those

things on their own tree creation.

Thank you to the David Sherman Foster Fund for their ongoing support of another fun and educational family program. On Tu B'Shevat we learned that the Land of Israel is described as "a land of wheat, and barley, and vines, and fig trees and pomegranates; a land of olive oil and honey (Deut. 8:8)." The praise of the land of Israel for its fruit trees is a deep environmental lesson, testifying to the importance

of nature and trees in Judaism. Thus, the collection for the

Jewish National Fund, that we solicited for this month and raised over \$150. Thank you for all the contributions. Feel free to use the link on the BSBI website if you

> would still like to participate. In addition to student presentations and playing *Kahoot* we also planted parsley which will be ready to harvest on Passover and be part of our seder plates. Finally, we enjoyed a sing-a-long led by our own Jane Zimmerman.

This year our Annual Lillian and George Sandals Memorial Dinner and Lecture, Monday, March 23rd at 6:30 pm (Minyan at 6:00 pm) will be presented by both BSBI Sisterhood and the BSBI Social Action Committee.

Our guest speaker will be Rabbi Richard L. Eisenberg author of "Judaism, Addiction and Recovery: A Spiritual and Faith-based Approach."

A native of Bridgeport, Rabbi Eisenberg received a BA from Duke University and an MA from Smith College and the Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS). In 1982, he received rabbinical ordination from JTS and went on to serve as a congregational rabbi for 35 years. Prior to joining B'nai Jacob in Woodbridge, CT, he held pulpits in Columbus, Georgia and Wayne, New Jersey. He received his Certificate in Drug and Alcohol Counseling from Gateway Community



College and worked for 10 years as a rehabilitation counselor at The APT Foundation in New Haven, where he provided group and individual therapy for people diagnosed with substance use disorders. During that time he also served part-time as rabbi at Beth El Synagogue in Torrington, which closed its doors in 2017.

Rabbi Eisenberg retired from The APT Foundation two years ago. In addition to his new book, he has written articles on intermarriage, Judaism, and addiction and the opioid crisis.

IRA Assets and Qualified Charitable Distributions

BSBI would like to encourage charitable donations, to help our congregants optimize their charitable giving and to reach their charitable goals. On behalf of the Endowment Board of Trustees I would like to review some of the benefits of gifting Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) to the Endowment. The QCDs may also be used to pay Synagogue dues as well as contribute to the Hineni Society.

<u>Donation of "Qualified Charitable Distributions" (QCD)</u> In legislation at year end 2016, Congress made permanent qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) from individual retirement accounts.

What are QCDs?

A QCD permits direct transfers to a qualified charity (or charities) totaling up to \$100,000 annually of tax-deferred IRA savings. QCDs offer advantages over taking a taxable IRA distribution and then contributing the proceeds of that distribution to a charity. That's because taxable IRA distributions must be included in adjusted gross income. Importantly, QCDs automatically satisfy required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year when the QCD is made. That's a real advantage for a charitably minded IRA owner who doesn't depend on some or all of the RMD for living expenses.

What are important things to know about QCDs?

Only individuals who've attained age 70 ½ or older on the date of distribution may make QCDs. The charitable organization must be an organization that qualifies for a charitable income tax deduction of an individual. The Beth Sholom B'nai Israel Synagogue and the BSBI Endowment qualify as such organizations The BSBI Endowment and Synagogue will be required to provide the same contribution acknowledgement to the owner of the IRA required claiming a charitable tax deduction. Failure to obtain the acknowledgement will quash the QCD. QCDs may be made from any IRA or individual retirement annuity, but not from a simplified employee pension, a simple retirement account, or an inherited IRA. Among other benefits, the use of QCDs for charity may reduce taxable income, reduce state and federal tax, reduce taxation of social security, reduce supplemental IRMMA payments to Medicare parts B and D. Individuals and couples with low as well as high incomes may benefit by contributing QCDs to charity.

Examples of using QCDs for charitable giving

There are several attractive options for the use of QCDs for charitable giving. For example one can use the QCD to pay Synagogue dues and contribute to Hineni. Another example of optimizing the use of QCD is to establish a **perpetual endowment** fund. By making a QCD donation to the Endowment of BSBI, the donor may create a \$25,000 endowment for BSBI. This endowment may be given over the course of a number of years to reach the level necessary to provide perpetual support of a \$1000 to **Hineni**. By adding to the donation annually the donor could reach a \$45,000 over a number of years. This amount would support a **perpetual Hineni donation at the \$1800** per year level. Details of further possibilities and arrangements for payment can be obtained from the Endowment members or via email noted below. Since the use of QCDs for charitable giving can have specific tax advantages the donor should consult their tax advisor prior to making a QCD contribution. Some plans require significant lead time to process the paper work, so advanced planning may be necessary.

Rabbi Richard L. Eisenberg was born in Bridgeport CT in 1952, received a BA from Duke University and an MA from Smith College and the Jewish Theological Seminary. In 1982 Rabbi Eisenberg received ordination from the Jewish Theological Seminary and went on to serve as a congregational rabbi spanning 35 years at synagogues in Columbus GA, Wayne NJ, Woodbridge CT and Torrington CT. He also worked for 10 years until 2017 as a rehabilitation counselor at The APT Foundation in New Haven CT where he provided group and individual therapy for people diagnosed with substance use disorders. He received his Certificate in Drug and Alcohol Counseling from Gateway Community College in 2007 and is a certified addictions counselor.

Rabbi Eisenberg has been active in the Rabbinical Assembly, having served on the Executive Council as well as chairing the Resolutions, Social Action and Ethics Committee. He also served on the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards and wrote the version of the Triennial Cycle for Torah reading that has become the accepted model in Conservative congregations. Rabbi Eisenberg was involved in ecumenical clergy associations in each of his communities and has devoted himself to interfaith work. His current focus is applying Jewish principles and values of spirituality to addictions treatment as well as conveying the message and power of recovery to Jewish communal life. Rabbi Eisenberg has written for the Forward and Tablet on the topics of intermarriage, Judaism and addiction and the opioid crisis. His new book is titled Judaism, Addiction and Recovery: A Spiritual and Faith-Based Approach.
