

Faith, Hope, Prayer

I am aware that some of our members have received emails that were supposed to be from me but were, in reality, fraudulent. The good news is that my account was not hacked. My email and all my personal data are all safe and sound behind strong passwords on all my accounts. I thank all of you who called me, worried that something nefarious had happened and that I might be in big trouble.





First of all, let me be clear. I have never and will never ask anyone for money by email. If I need anyone to make a donation, I generally make an appointment and ask in person. I also insist that all donations are made out directly to BSBI and never have any of it sent directly to me. Even the Rabbi Discretionary Fund collects donations only through the synagogue office, and those checks go directly to the bank. Most times I will never see the donation until the receipt from the bank makes it to my desk. The checks I write to help others are very confidential. All donations to the RDF are handled like any other donation to BSBI and directed to the appropriate account

In addition, I don't need anyone ever to buy gift cards for me. This is a well-known scam on the Internet. You get someone to buy expensive gift cards and then have them email the number on the back to the sender. The scam works because you don't need a gift card to use one; you only need the number on the back. The minute someone sends a number, that card is used and the card you are holding becomes worthless. Once the number is sent, there is nothing that can be done to stop the theft. *Don't buy me or anyone else a gift card that you are not planning to use as a gift.*

Third, if an email from me or anyone else looks suspicious, it is probably a scam. It could come from a family member, a good friend, a business associate, or someone you have not seen for a long time. If you want to be absolutely sure that the email is not spoofed, then just call and find out. But you can also, if you know how, just check the email address of what you have received. It will tell you instantly that this did not come from my account, rather it is from some made up account from somewhere else. I only send emails from one account: Msharmelech@gmail.com. I get emails from my synagogue account; Rabbenu@myshul.org, but if you get an email from me, it will only come from my Gmail account. If you discover that my name is on any other email, you should report it as spam to your email provider so they will filter it away for you.

Never reply to an email from the wrong account. If you do, you will just be letting the sender know he or she has caught someone with their "bait." Report it as spam, and then delete it. If there is a link in the email, DO NOT click on it; that will bring new and dangerous headaches to you. DO NOT download anything either; they are trying to compromise your computer. Just delete it. If you see that it is not from my account, then don't even bother to open it. You can't cause a problem just by opening an email but if you click on a link, even by mistake, it can be a problem, so don't open a suspicious email if you don't have to.

If you really need to email me, use the address that is in your address book: one of the two listed above. If you have any other address for me in your address book, you can safely delete it.


I am sorry that we live in a world where even a rabbi can be spoofed. But anyone can be spoofed and all of us have to be careful with the emails we open. Email is a wonderful way of communicating, but like a phone call or a letter, there is always someone who can think up a way to misuse these methods to steal your money.


I am interested in growing your soul and your heart. I will never ask you for money except through regular synagogue channels. We have safeguards to make sure that all the money we collect goes directly to the place you have chosen for your donation. We NEVER violate those safeguards. If you get an email that asks you to do something outside accepted practice, it is a scam. Delete it, and you will sleep better knowing you are too smart to be scammed.







Our Children, Our Future

In days to come, when your children ask: "What does this mean?" respond by saying, "With a mighty hand the LORD brought us out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery."—Exodus 13:14

As I write this article, we are in the midst of Passover preparations. We have lots of symbols, questions, and stories to remind us not to take for granted the freedom that we have, especially living in this country.

The Seder begins with the youngest child asking the Four Questions. But adults also want to know: "What does this all mean?"

We want our children to be interested in our story, our Jewish story, so that they will listen to it and make it their own. All year long children ask questions—about school, nature, life, whatever comes into their minds. Sometimes we have an answer; sometimes we don't. But our answers—or lack of them—will shape their thoughts, and their thoughts will shape their future.

Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, the late Chief Rabbi of Britain, summed it up this way: "The world we build tomorrow is born in the stories we tell our children today." On Passover, we celebrate freedom. We recount our own journey from bitter slavery to sweet freedom, and we cherish this God-given right. Recent studies demonstrate that children reflect the stories that they hear. So what stories are we telling our children?

As we enter the summer vacation phase of our religious school, make the time to read to your children. Share the stories from the Bible or other books that exhibit values such as kindness and faith. Have them read to you as well; our library is filled with engaging books for children of all ages. Remind them to practice the Hebrew that they have worked so hard to master during the year. (They all have copies of our Siddur.) Bring them to Shabbat services so they can practice the prayers and keep learning.

Today's children are tomorrow's leaders. Let us teach them right—and learn with them so that our questions are answered as well.

- As the school year comes to a close, please join with us on the last **Sunday**, **May 15**, for a special day. **School will begin at 10:00 a.m.**, with the end-of-year BBQ at noon.
- Then on the following **Shabbat**, **May 21**, **at 10:00 o'clock**, join us as we honor our teachers, students, and parents during the awards assembly at our final Junior Congregation Service of the year. We will celebrate a successful year in which all have done their very best.

This Date in Jewish History Nisan 30 - Sivan 1

- **Iyar 7** Chaim Weizmann was elected the first president of the State of Israel on this date in 1948.
- **Iyar 18** Betty Hart, the first official Jewish convert in America, was married to Moses Nathans on this date in 1794. The two prior conversions were not accepted by Orthodox authorities.
- **Iyar 26** War broke out between Israel and the Arab nations on this date in 1967. It would become known as the Six-Day War.
- **Iyar 28** Israel captured Jericho, Bethlehem, Sharm-el-Sheikh and Jerusalem on this date in 1967. This day was to become the date of Yom Yerushalayim, the day we celebrate the reunification of Jerusalem.
- **Sivan 1** Solomon Schechter discovered a fragment from the original Hebrew text of "Ben Sira" on this date in 1896. It led to the discovery of the Cairo Genizah.



This year's speaker is Rabbi Ami Hersh, who will speak about his alternate route after being ordained as a rabbi at the Jewish Theological Seminary.

Rabbi Hersh is the director of Ramah Day Camp in Nyack, NY, where he has worked since 2000. He also is part of the rabbinic team at the Orangetown, NY, Jewish Center. Rabbi Hersh, an alum of the Wexner Graduate Fellowship, was ordained at JTS in May 2012 and received an MA in Jewish education from the Davidson School of Jewish Education in 2013. A graduate of the University of Hartford, he holds degrees in elementary education and Judaic studies. Prior to entering rabbinical school he taught at the Solomon Schechter School of Greater Hartford. 

Brotherhood's May Speaker: Emma Luxemburg Sunday, May 1st at 9:30 am

Emma Luxemburg, a lifelong member of BSBI, spent her past academic semester in Arezzo, Italy, studying at the Accademia dell'Arte. At ADA, she was introduced to Commedia dell'Arte, an Italian theatre form based on stock characters in various scenarios. Sadly, the stock characters of Commedia are no exception to the perpetual stereotypes that accompany stock characters in most forms of theatre and entertainment. One of these harmful stereotypes is based on the old rich business owner, Pantalone. Through the character's actions, speech, and mask, harmful anti-Semitic stereotypes are perpetuated. Through a brief overview of Commedia, Luxemburg's experience with the role, and how the role is evolving today, we will discuss how characters like these can be seen in our media, how to recognize them, and reclaim them as a symbol of our shared culture.



MANCHESTER BROTHERHOOD IN ACTION (BIA) -\$6,600 FOR VICTORIANA

The Manchester Brotherhood in Action (BIA) is an informal charity group made up of Beth Sholom B'nai Israel Brotherhood, Manchester UNICO, two Masonic lodges (Manchester #73 and Friendship #145), and two Knights of Columbus Councils (#573 and #1155). BIA has been in existence since 1987 and has raised over \$132,000, giving each year's proceeds to local families with children having life-threatening illnesses. Before COVID, we annually conducted the BIA fundraiser, a great community breakfast event that usually served over 300 people. Attendees, along with other generous donors from our six fraternal organizations provided the funds needed to support our annual donation to the beneficiary families. However, after missing a year (2021) because of the COVID pandemic, this year it was decided to forgo the breakfast rather than contend with uncertainty related to the changing pandemic status. Instead, we solicited contributions directly from the memberships of our six organizations to again support a local family confronting a very difficult challenge.

We are happy to report that the collective generosity of our six BIA member organizations was wonderful. As a result, on Sunday April 10 during a brief reception at the Manchester Masonic Temple, we were blessed to be able to present \$6,600 to the family of Victoriana Diaz. The proceeds will help the family defray continuing medical expenses. Despite what she has been through*, Victoriana is a little angel who can easily melt hearts with her personality and smile. At the reception she was a happy, polite, and smiling little girl, readily engaging with everyone in our group, and patiently holding the poster and her smile as all the photos were taken.

We, the BSBI representatives to Manchester Brotherhood-In-Action, say *Todah Rabbah* to all BSBI congregants who generously supported this year's important fun-raising event. The BSBI contributions had a significant impact on the amount of the BIA contribution to Victoriana's family. Sixty-seven BSBI families, individual members along with the Brotherhood, donated a total of \$2,267. **Thank you again for your kind generosity during this annual community effort.**

*Five-year old Victoriana suffers from a brain cancer called medulloblastoma. It is an invasive, rapidly growing tumor that spreads through the cerebrospinal fluid. She has had surgeries to remove the tumors and has also undergone numerous chemotherapy and radiation treatments at Boston Children's Hospital and Connecticut Children's Medical Center. With these treatments, Victoriana has endured many side effects, including partial hearing loss in one ear as well as speech challenges. Currently undergoing physical and occupational therapy, Victoriana hopes to return to a normal, healthy life in the very near future.



IRA Assets and Qualified Charitable Distributions

BSBI would like to encourage charitable donations, to help our congregants optimize their charitable giving and to reach their charitable goals. On behalf of the Endowment Board of Trustees I would like to review some of the benefits of gifting Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) to the Endowment. The QCDs may also be used to pay Synagogue dues as well as contribute to the Hineni Society.

<u>Donation of "Qualified Charitable Distributions" (QCD)</u>
In legislation at year end 2016, Congress made permanent qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) from individual retirement accounts.

What are QCDs?

A QCD permits direct transfers to a qualified charity (or charities) totaling up to \$100,000 annually of tax-deferred IRA savings. QCDs offer advantages over taking a taxable IRA distribution and then contributing the proceeds of that distribution to a charity. That's because taxable IRA distributions must be included in adjusted gross income. Importantly, QCDs automatically satisfy required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year when the QCD is made. That's a real advantage for a charitably minded IRA owner who doesn't depend on some or all of the RMD for living expenses.

What are important things to know about QCDs?

Only individuals who've attained age 70 ½ or older on the date of distribution may make QCDs. The charitable organization must be an organization that qualifies for a charitable income tax deduction of an individual. The Beth Sholom B'nai Israel Synagogue and the BSBI Endowment qualify as such organizations The BSBI Endowment and Synagogue will be required to provide the same contribution acknowledgement to the owner of the IRA required claiming a charitable tax deduction. Failure to obtain the acknowledgement will quash the QCD. QCDs may be made from any IRA or individual retirement annuity, but not from a simplified employee pension, a simple retirement account, or an inherited IRA. Among other benefits, the use of QCDs for charity may reduce taxable income, reduce state and federal tax, reduce taxation of social security, reduce supplemental IRMMA payments to Medicare parts B and D. Individuals and couples with low as well as high incomes may benefit by contributing QCDs to charity.

Examples of using QCDs for charitable giving

There are several attractive options for the use of QCDs for charitable giving. For example one can use the QCD to pay Synagogue dues and contribute to Hineni. Another example of optimizing the use of QCD is to establish a **perpetual endowment** fund. By making a QCD donation to the Endowment of BSBI, the donor may create a \$25,000 endowment for BSBI. This endowment may be given over the course of a number of years to reach the level necessary to provide perpetual support of a \$1000 to **Hineni**. By adding to the donation annually the donor could reach a \$45,000 over a number of years. This amount would support a **perpetual Hineni donation at the \$1800** per year level. Details of further possibilities and arrangements for payment can be obtained from the Endowment members or via email noted below. Since the use of QCDs for charitable giving can have specific tax advantages the donor should consult their tax advisor prior to making a QCD contribution. Some plans require significant lead time to process the paper work, so advanced planning may be necessary.




