Tomorrow, when you are called to the Torah, you will take your place as a full member of the Jewish Community. With that, come obligations and responsibilities as well as privileges and gifts. On behalf of Temple Sinai's Sisterhood and Brotherhood, I present you with this set of candlesticks and a Kiddush cup. When you use them, we hope that you will always think of this special milestone in your life.

[NEW] In honor of your Bar/Bat Mitzvah, two trees have been planted in Israel for you by Saul and Pat Ziv, teachers in our religious school. Saul and Pat congratulate you on your achievement and hope you will visit, support, and always love Israel.

This day is only the beginning of your Jewish journey. We encourage you to continue in our High School, to participate in Confirmation and to become active in our movement's Regional Youth Group.

This morning, we present you with your Bar/Bat Mitzvah certificate. This morning, we also present you with two scholarships to help you get to Israel.

The National Federation of Temple Youth presents you with a \$250 gift certificate and the Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest presents you with a \$1000 gift certificate; both to be applied to an organized, educational peer group trip during your high school years. Ideally, we hope you will go to Israel in the summer after your Confirmation.
