

From The Rabbi

In the Mishnah Kelim it says: "There are ten levels of holiness. The Land of Israel is holier than all other lands. In what does its holiness consist? That from it is brought the Omer offering, the First Fruits offering and the Two Showbreads, which is not the case from all other lands (1:6)." The Mishnah goes on to list the other nine levels of holiness, all the way up to the Holy of Holies in the heart of the Holy Temple. These ten levels are derived from the ten levels of holiness of the Israelite encampment in the desert, from the outer Camp of Israel to the inner Holy of Holies of the Mishkan. When Am Yisrael entered the Land of Israel, the halakhah essentially mapped the structure of the Camp of Israel of the desert surrounding the Mishkan onto the Land of Israel itself.

It is significant that holiness is defined in the Mishnah not in terms of some intrinsic state of being, but in terms of Avodah, acts of service: B ringing the Omer offering of barley during Pesach, bringing the First Fruits, bringing the Showbread. Anne and I are in Israel at the moment. We just finished having a wonderful group dinner with many of the young people from our Kehillah who are studying in Israel for the year. It was inspiring to hear about their learning experiences and their service activities in Israel, their Avodah, and to sense their excitement and enthusiasm. This is the real meaning of Kedushah, the holiness they are experiencing that comes from Mitzvah action.

We can all be deeply proud of our children in Israel, and they can inspire us by their example. We, too, even in the Diaspora, can bring more Kedushah into our lives and our families and our homes through more Avodah, more acts of service. Choose another mitzvah to add to your daily practice. Come to minyan more often and on time. Come to a shiur. Get involved in Tzedakah or Chessed activities. Find more opportunities to help others inside and outside our community. In these ways, inspired by the young people of our Kehillah, we connect to the holiness of the Land of Israel, and through our service help bring more Kedushah to the world.

What is your favorite part of Sharon?


We love the diversity of community and how well the various denominations get along with each other. Also we love the lake in the summer.
