If you are using the typical small colored candles, light at 4:52 p.m. to ensure the lights last until 5:25 pm.


A few years back the board started discussing how can we better support those families with Special needs children. Now, with all of Jodi's guidance, we are making this a reality.

## From The Rabbi

"In those days, at this time."

The Sefat Emet (5661) comments that the Jews of the generation of the Maccabees, battling Hellenistic oppression that tried to extinguish the light of Torah, gave their lives to serve Ha-Shem even in the midst of great darkness. Because of their self-sacrifice they merited the enlightenment of the hidden light from the depths of Torah, a deeper awareness of the inner meaning of Torah. Also because of their self-sacrifice, a residual illumination from this light continues to shine during the same season, every year, even in times of darkness and oppression – and the lights of Hanukkah remind us of this great, hidden, spiritual light.

In our own time, we, Am Yisrael, are suffering oppression and attack and existential threat, in Israel and throughout the world. This is a dark time, not only for the Jewish people, but for humanity, as we witness terrible cruelty perpetrated by misguided religious fanatics in the Middle East and Africa. The lesson of the Maccabees is that there are times when it is imperative to stand up and actively oppose evil – and this is such a time.

May all leaders of good will and all people of good will find inspiration and courage from the example of the Maccabees, and find illumination from the hidden light that shines at this time, to take strong action to push back the darkness enveloping the world. May we rekindle a sense of compassion, a sense of brotherhood and sisterhood among all people, a sense of human heartedness. May we connect, through the power of this season, with the true inner light of Torah and the inspiration of

Ha-Shem to stand up for truth and goodness. "In the darkness there shall shine light for the upright (Ps. 112:4)," speedily, in our days.
