

From The Rabbi

This year, Shavuot is followed by Parshat Beha'alotkha, offering a provocative counterpoint. Rashi calculates that after the overwhelming revelation of Torah on Mount Sinai, Am Yisrael spent eleven months at the mountain studying and internalizing the Torah they had been given (Num. 10:13). It is in Beha'alotkha that they first leave Sinai. The moment was like a graduation of sorts, and should have featured a grateful, nostalgic look back at the extraordinary events they had experienced, and joyful look forward towards the great promise of their destiny. But in the Gemara Shabbat 116a, Rabbi Hama bar Hanina interprets "And they traveled from the mountain of Ha-Shem (Num. 10:33)," ... they departed from Ha-Shem." Tosafot explains, citing the Midrash Yelamdeinu, that "they traveled from Mount Sinai for three days like a child leaving school, fleeing and running off. So, too, they fled from Har Sinai for three days, because they had learned a lot of Torah at Sinai." Instead of taking up their journey from the mountain reluctantly, they bolted like children when school is out, impatient, tired of all the learning. This flight from responsibility and commitment colors the rest of their encounters in the desert, as they lurch from one crisis to another, on their long, circuitous way towards the Land of Israel. It would take many years for Am Yisrael to learn to absorb and integrate the wisdom of Torah and Mitzvot into their lives and really live up to their destiny – and we're not there even yet.

This attitude that regards Torah learning and Mitzvah practice as a burden, something to flee, or a speed-bump on the way towards fulfilling our appetites, still plagues Am Yisrael, and Modern Orthodoxy in particular. The strength of the Modern Orthodox vision is its wisdom, honesty, and confidence that the divine origin of Torah means it embraces and comprises all truth, properly understood, without the need to retreat to a false literalism, anti-intellectualism or a neurotically anxious approach to halakhah. Our openness to the world should mean we are constantly checking ourselves to make sure we are really following Ha-Shem's will and not some illusion or fantasy generated by ignorance or small-mindedness. But the vulnerability of Modern Orthodoxy is that this very openness can admit foreign values and desires that throw us off course, distract us and dilute our Torah learning or Mitzvah practice. The authentic Modern Orthodox vision, which is the true vision of Torah, sees Torah learning and Mitzvah practice as a thoughtful, heartfelt spiritual discipline integrated into an intellectually honest, emotionally sane and physically healthy life.

As our children move up and approach the summer, after their year of intense learning, we can sympathize with their desire to let loose a bit and enjoy the freedom of less structured time. Those children who go to camp and those who stay to enjoy the natural beauty of Sharon get to explore other dimensions of their personalities, to be active in Mitzvot, in new relationships, to move from book learning to life learning. For all of us, adults and children alike, the summer should not be a vacation from Torah, but rather a refreshing time to internalize its real living lessons into a healthy, engaged and awakened life.
