### A Message From Our President

All of us were horrified by the Oct 7th brutal Hamas attacks on Israel.

I was in shock, and I bet you were too. I knew that Hamas was a terrorist group, but the extent of their evilness was beyond words. So many Israelis were savagely murdered, tortured, raped, or wounded. Children and Jews of all ages were dragged out of their homes and kidnapped. Thousands of innocent, precious Jewish lives were destroyed on that day.

I felt helpless. What could we do?
Of course, we could send money, and we did.
We could gather our Congregation to pray, and we did.
We could contact our family and friends in Israel, and we did.

The Cantor could send a message of love and hope to our Congregation, and she did.

It wasn't enough.

I got an email from the Jewish Federation of Greater Houston inviting me to travel with other leaders of Jewish organizations and Federation Staff to a rally to show support for Israel the following week in Washington, DC. If I wanted to go, I needed to tell them immediately. And I did.

It was my first time attending a demonstration, rally, march, or protest. And it will be a day I will never forget. Two hundred ninety thousand supporters of Israel crowded the area in front of the Capitol. Despite the short notice, people came from all parts of the country, about 300 from Greater Houston. Carol Schorn designed a CBE T-shirt for me, and the Jewish Federation also provided sweatshirts. It was such a joy to travel with about 150 enthusiastic Jews, who sang Am Yisrael Chai as the plane landed. We encountered other Jewish groups at the airport, all anxious to show our love and support for Israel. Once we left the airport, we walked to the train station, where we saw thousands of Jews singing and chanting familiar Hebrew melodies. For me, it was breathtaking and very inspiring.

When we got to the rally site, I was pumped with energy and gratitude that I could make this trip. Every speaker delivered an inspirational message of love for Israel, the importance of Israel's existence, Jewish values, or the bond between American Jews and Israel. At many appropriate moments, the quiet crowd burst into chants of Am Yisrael Chai, Bring them home, or No ceasefire. The passion in the voices was clear and loud. This was a time when Orthodox, Conservative, and Reform Jews sang and chanted in one voice, a spiritual, beautiful voice. Leading Democrats and Republicans also spoke in one voice in support of Israel.

We sang Hatikvah, and I was impressed that everyone around me knew the words. We said the mourner's Kaddish together and prayed for Israel together. Being immersed in togetherness, unity, and love for Israel was a joy.

Realistically, I know that attending a rally doesn't alleviate the pain that Israeli families are feeling or minimize our concern about the rising number of Jewish Hate incidents happening in Texas, the USA, and the rest of the world. However, it did awaken an even deeper commitment in me that Judaism must survive and thrive in our Fort Bend community and our nation. We need to do more. 

Traveling to Houston is unnecessary to see an INCREDIBLE Hannukah-decorated house.


There is a great one in Fort Bend County!


