Thanksgiving comes but once a year; giving thanks is for every day. If you've ever met me, you know I'm a big proponent of small gratitude--by which I mean finding the seemingly smallest thing I can to be grateful for. Things we take for granted but would *really* miss if they were gone.

You've heard these three before: Washing machines. Curbside garbage pickup. Ice whenever we want some. That's not to say these are the things for which I am *most* grateful. Top of my list is the same as everyone else's: family, friends, health, food, clothing, and shelter. We know not to take those for granted, and we know there are many people on the planet who cannot count on those things. The challenge is seeking out more and more things to be an excuse to exercise the gratitude muscle. And the more we are able to build up that muscle, the more calm we are likely to find. The more gratitude, the more patience, the more resilience: the more contentment.

It's not always possible to feel gratitude or even think of something for which to feel gratitude. After a tragedy, for instance, or when mental illness prevents it. It is not shameful to be unable to be grateful. But when our life circumstances allow it, gratitude can be healing and strengthening. It can give us perspective on what is truly important and affect our worldview.

Take a moment to choose something "small" to be grateful for. Put a note on the fridge or your bathroom mirror to remind yourself to give thanks for your small something. See how it makes you feel and how it directs your thoughts.



We will meet up at the Sukkah.


Join us as we experience nature, pray together, and share snacks along the path.

Kristallnacht: Finding Strength and Inspiration through Reflection and Learning

Don't Miss this Exclusive Virtual Event for Members of Congregations Participating in ADL's Kulanu Program

Join Kulanu congregations from across North America for a virtual learning session and text study marking Kristallnacht, featuring Rabbi David Wolpe, ADL's Rabbinic Fellow. This session will reflect on the events of Kristallnacht through the lens of Jewish thought leaders and foundational texts, offering hope in the face of rising antisemitism and hate today.

Kristallnacht, the night of the broken glass, occurred November 9-10, 1938, when mobs took to the streets of Germany and Austria, committing a wave of violent attacks against the Jewish community including the burning of synagogues, Torah scrolls and holy books, the desecration of Jewish cemeteries and schools and the murder of almost 100 Jews.

As ADL's Rabbinic Fellow, Rabbi David Wolpe serves as a thought leader within the organization, advising on interfaith and intergroup affairs, and sharing his thoughts and reflections with the community at large. Rabbi Wolpe, who has authored eight books, is the Max Webb Emeritus Rabbi of Sinai Temple in Los Angeles and was named the most influential Rabbi in America by Newsweek.




