### זצ"ל רב דר. ש'לום ברוער

The 6<sup>th</sup> of Av (this year, July 15<sup>th</sup>) marks the ninety-fifth Yahrzeit of Rav Dr. Shlomo Breuer, son-in-law and successor of Rav Shmshon Raphael Hirsch. Born in Pilisvorosvar, Hungary, Rav Breuer learned under his maternal grandfather, Rav Shimon Wiener, as well as in Nitra, before joining the Pressburg Yeshiva then under the leadership of the Ksav Sofer, Rav Avrohom Shmuel Binyomin Sofer.



Rav Breuer led the Frankfurt Kehilla from 1890 until his petiro in 1926. Rav Breuer strengthened and expanded what his father-in-law and predecessor, Rav Hirsch, had built up the Frankfurt Kehilla to be, most noticeably with the establishment, in 1893, of the Frankfurt Yeshiva, (Torah Lehranstalt). It was also during Rav Breuer's Rabbonus that the imposing Friedberger Anlage Shul was built (pictured above right)

Rav Breuer established the "Orthodoxer Rabbinerverband" and the "Orthodoxer Gemeindeverband," to strengthen both his Kehilla as well as the Kehillos of Germany and beyond. It was in this same vein that Rav Breuer played a major role in the founding of Agudath Israel, in 1912. Rav Breuer's sermons, collected and redacted as the three volumes of *Chochmo uMusar*, as well as his Sefer *Divrei Shlomo* continue to be learned to this day.

**RAV ELIYOHU GLUCKSMAN זצ"ל**

This coming 4<sup>th</sup> of Av will mark the seventeenth Yahrzeit of our unforgettable Dayan Eliyohu Dov Glucksman. Originally from Germany, Rav Glucksman, with the support of his wife, Rebbetzin Ruth Glucksman, had the rare opportunity to learn in the Kollel of the Chazon Ish זצ"ל, where he shared a bench with Rav Yaakov Yisroel Kanievsky, the Steipler Go'on זצ"ל. Rav Glucksman's Seforim—*Birkas HaShulchon* (original frontispiece pictured below right) and his Tziyunim on Shas—are well-known.



Rav Glucksman developed a unique teaching style which endeared him to hundreds of Talmidim and Talmidos. Rav Glucksman joined the Kehilla in the 1960's not only as Dayan, but as Youth Director, a role which led to the decades of his teaching in both the Rika Breuer Teachers Seminary and our Beth Jacob high school. Rebbetzin Glucksman, too, taught in YRSRH, as a beloved sixth-grade Morah for many years. Even when Rav Glucksman, due to failing eye-sight, stopped officially teaching, he still would address the classes on occasions such as the anniversary of Kristallnacht, until very close to his petiro.

**RAV MOSHE YEHUDA JACOBOVITS זצ"ל**

The Yahrzeit of Dayan Moshe Yehuda Jacobovits, the 29<sup>th</sup> of Av, will fall this year on August 19<sup>th</sup>. Rav Jacobovits was born in 1890 in Lackenbach, one of the Sheva Kehillos. His father, Rav Shlomo Zalman Jacobovits, was the Dayan of the Kehilla there, a position Rav Moshe Yehuda's maternal grandfather had also held. Rav Moshe Yehuda learned in Galanta, under Rav Yosef Tzvi Duschinski, and in Pressburg under Rav Akiva Sofer.

Rav Jacobovits served as Rav in Köln for twenty years, until the Nazis' rise to power and the impending Churban Europe forced him to flee, first to Strasbourg, where he served as Rosh Yeshiva until the outbreak of World War II, then to various locations in France, and ultimately to Switzerland.



Through all of his travails, Rav Jacobovits drew those he met close to Torah. Under exceedingly difficult circumstances, he looked to care for the Tzorchei Tzibur of the place he was in, both in France and later in the D. P. camps, seeing to the baking of Matzo for Pesach, the making of Shoforos for Rosh HaShono, to Talmud Torah, the establishment of Shuls, and, in one instance, the construction of a Mikve. After the war, Rav Jacobovits established a Yeshiva in Lugano, Switzerland.

When Rav Jacobovits arrived in Washington Heights in 1947, he was appointed Dayan and supported Rav Breuer in all facets of the young Kehilla, including, crucially, Kashrus, as well as taking over for Rav Breuer when the Rav was recuperating from a heart attack. Dayan Jacobovits was Niftar only three years later, in 1950, on Shabbos, the 29<sup>th</sup> of Av. Some twelve years after his petiro, his widow, Rebbetzin Hanna Jacobovits, and sons published some of his Kisvei Yad on Chumash, the Megillos, and the Hagada shel Pesach, under the title *Zichron Moshe*. An expanded edition has been reprinted by his family.

### MR. SIDNEY GUTMAN ז"ל

His Sheloshim having just recently passed, our Kehilla notes with continued and great sadness the loss of our member Mr. Sidney Gutman, an Oseik BeTzorchei Tzibur BeEmuno par excellence.

Mr. Gutman served for many years on the Board of Trustees and on the Chevra Kadisha, where he was known for his great efforts to attend Kevuros, bar minon. Mr. Gutman was also deeply involved in fundraising for our Yeshiva: In the era of Dinner Meetings, he was a mainstay and driving force behind their success; he was also almost always among the top solicitors of ads for our Yeshiva's Journal.

Besides for these more "standard" Tzorchei Tzibur, Mr. Gutman took on many specific projects, ranging from hiring boys to set up and clean up at the Siyumei Bechorim on Erev Pesach, to arranging the catered Sukka meals, to approaching members and friends to donate to the Shul's Yayin LeKidush, every year—something he did personally and individually, either in person or by calling the individual, not relying on mass mailings, signs, or emails. Above all, his very being, with his kind words and good humor was a font of Gemilus Chassodim for all those who interacted with him.

Below, we print some thoughts from a very close friend and classmate of his:

"As a friend of mine for at least 65 years, it is difficult to pick what to say about Sidney. I have decided to share two stories that I think will capture the essence of Sidney.

I used to sit next to him in Shul and in the 90 Bennett Avenue Minyan. When my eyesight started to fail, he would bring me, every day, a Siddur with larger letters. One day I got a package in the mail. It was a weekday Siddur and a Shabbos Siddur, with super large print, printed by the Hebrew Institute for the Blind. Without any discussion, he took notice of my situation (as he did for everyone ) and tried to resolve it.

On the day he was niftar, I thought to try to pay him one last well-deserved Kovod, to bury him the same day. Although he was niftar at a time that would have been too late to generally accommodate such a wish, we worked on it and Boruch HaShem we were able to. That being said, it was going to require a good amount of overtime by the cemetery (extremely expensive ). When the manager of the cemetery heard it was Sidney, she immediately said "There will no charge for the overtime. All additional expenses will be covered by the cemetery." She continued to relate, that every time Sidney came to the cemetery, he would stop by the office and say hello, as his father, Mr. Harry Gutman, had done, too. "He showed so much respect for us, we wanted to take this opportunity to show our gratitude ( Hakoras Hatov )."

I hope that with these two stories, I can share a glimpse of both his private and more public side. He had true עניוּת."

## DAY CAMP GRANT INFORMATION FROM AGUDATH ISRAEL

Covid Tax Tip from the IRS: For 2021 only, qualifying families may be eligible to receive up to \$8,000 as a refundable tax credit to cover employment-related childcare expenses including...day camp tuition! The (currently) single-year enhancements to the Child and Dependent Care tax credit were included in the American Rescue Plan Act enacted earlier this year. The changes include a significantly higher tax credit amount and allows qualifying families earning up to \$125,000 to receive the 50% tax credit before it begins to phase out. The credit is available when both parents are working or looking for work, and there are special rules when a parent is incapable of caring for him/herself or if a parent is a full-time student. Please speak to your tax advisor about whether or not the credit applies to your situation. Please help spread the word and share this information.

This credit is an addition to the enhancements to the separate Child Tax Credit which will lead to monthly payments for qualifying families beginning July 15th. Those payments will be up to \$300 per month for each qualifying child under age 6 and up to \$250 per month for each qualifying child ages 6 to 17. ### **SPOTLIGHT ON: Mrs. Helen Ettlinger—WHAT'S IT LIKE TO BE...the "First Lady of KAJ?"**

*Since this was an election year in the United States, KAJN thought it would be apropos to interview our own First Lady, Mrs. Helen Ettlinger, wife of our dynamic and accomplished Kehilla President, Mr. Alan Ettlinger. Helen is also one of our beloved preschool Moros, whose love and caring has impacted scores of YRSRH's youngest Talmidim and Talmidos.*

**KAJN:** What was your reaction when your husband first mentioned that he was considering running for President?



**HE:** While I was surprised, I think it is important that all our members play an active role in our Kehilla—even if it means that dinner will be served later than usual!

**KAJN:** What are some character traits necessary for being a supportive First Lady?

**HE:** Patience. Especially when family plans get changed due to Kehilla matters. Also, the ability to tell people, "Please speak to the Board; I have not been elected yet!" Alan does a very good job of not sharing Board discussions or issues that should not be shared.

**KAJN:** What are some responsibilities a President has that you think might surprise our readers?

**KAJN:** What are you most proud of in terms of your husband's many accomplishments as President?

**HE:** That he is one of the people who is able to work for the Kehilla. My father-in-law o.h. used to say that the Kehilla and Yeshiva are like a Swiss watch. All you see is the face of the watch, but there are many cogs and gears under the face of the watch. If one of the cogs or wheels fails to do its job, the watch stops no matter what is happening on the face of the watch. He said the Kehilla and Yeshiva are the same, it takes all of our members to work for our institutions so that the Kehilla and Yeshiva can work.
