FROM THE RABBINATE: SHEMITA 5782 UPDATE

Vegetables:

All **fresh** vegetables from Eretz Yisroel may be purchased; Terumos and Maasros must be taken. **Canned** vegetables (e.g., pickles, peppers) without a reliable Shemita-Hashgocho may be from Shemita and are forbidden (איסור ספיהין). Check all labels!

Fruits:

Almost all fruits from Eretz Yisroel may now be purchased with the exception of **dried dates**, and **canned fruit** without a reliable Shemita-Hashgocho.

Wines from Eretz Yisroel without a reliable Shemita-Hashgocho may be forbidden (זמן הביעור). Check all labels!

Peanuts from Eretz Yisroel remain forbidden (ספיחין).

TA'ANIYOS BEHA"B, KRISTALNACHT, AND YOM KIPPUR KOTTON

The Monday, Thursday and Monday preceding Rosh Chodesh Kislev are the days observed according to our minhag as מבהייב, (Taanios Sheini Chamishi VeSheini), as days of prayer and fasting during which special Selichos are said.

This year, the anniversary of Kristallnacht, 16 Marcheshvan, was the Tuesday before Taanis Sheini Kammo. It was on the 16th of Marcheshvan 5699, Wednesday night, November 9th and continuing into Thursday, November 10, 1938, eighty-five years ago, that the Nazi furor destroyed almost all the synagogues in Germany and Austria. Countless Sifrei Torah and other seforim were burned, homes and stores broken into and looted, and all men between the ages of sixteen and sixty arrested, many assaulted, and some ninety-one murdered outright.

Taanis Sheini Basro was also, this year, Erev Rosh Chodesh Kisleiv. Due to the ongoing, serious situation in Eretz Yisroel, the day was observed as a Yom Kippur Kotton. Chazon Lasdun led the Yom Kippur Kotton services at Mincha.

SISTERHOOD VIDEO EVENT

To commemorate the yahrzeit of Rochel Imeinu (often given as 11 Marcheshvan), the Washington Heights community joined with the international Jewish community on Nov I/18 Marcheshvan in viewing the video produced to give chizuk to Klal Yisroel during this difficult time and to serve as a fundraiser for aniyei Eretz Yisroel. Mrs. Sarah Herbsman ably served as chairwoman, introduced the program and leading the assembled in several chapters of Tehillim.

Rabbi Zev Leff was the first speaker. He spoke about the recent events taking place in Eretz Yisroel and gave chizuk based on the verse, "Eis tzoro leYisroel, umimeno nivashei'o." The tragedy we are going through can/may <u>itself</u> bring the salvation. If one searches within oneself after experiencing yissurim, and finds what s/he needs to correct, and does, in fact, make such improvements/amends, then the power of good will overcome the power of darkness.

Rav Shmuel Kamenetzky reminded us that Rochel Imeinu continues to daven for us, her children in Golus. Rav Shmuel was followed by Rabbi Paysach Krohn. Rabbi Krohn stressed how we can emulate "Mama Rochel" to help bring a yeshua. We should help people avoid having pain, listen sensitively when people share their feelings, and daven for people who are going through trying times.

The message given by Rabbi Joey Haber spoke to the difficulty in dealing with our own pain and the pain of others. We're all interconnected, so we share each other's lives. We should not judge. We should focus on what we can influence and not spend too much time focusing on the things we cannot control. Realize that, often, we are all "going through the same stuff." This will help us have empathy. Giving others chizuk can have a boomerang effect on us, giving us comfort and support, as well. Lastly, having empathy can help us know how to anticipate what another may need so that we can offer it before they ask.

Rabbi Y.Y. Jacobson told a moving story about Rebbetzin Rivky Holtzberg, the Chabad shelucha murdered in Mumbai in 2008. Rebbetzin Tehila Jaeger spoke about the natural feminine instinct to be noseis be'ol and how we need to balance our deep feelings with our need for action and the capacity to "go on."

The final speaker, Rabbi Rafael Kruskal, gave an update on some of the Ukrainian refugees. He leads an operation that brought over 1000 Jews from the Ukraine to safer grounds in Romania. The cost of feeding, clothing, and housing these precious Yidden is staggering. The temporary new life he and his staff have

created for these refugees is truly remarkable. He encourages every Jew to feel areivus for each other, to help with his mission in Romania and to help the needy in Israel.

In the zechus of our mitzvos, tzedoko, areivus and tefillos, may the Yeshua come soon!



We are pleased to announce the publication of a new edition of **Chochmo U'Mussar** by Rav Dr. Salomon Breuer Feldheim Publishers

Rav Breuer (1850-1926) was a *talmid* of the *Ksav Sofer* and successor to his father-in-law, Rav Samson Raphael Hirsch, as Rav of the Frankfurt Kehilla, known as *Adas Yeshurun*. He was founder and Rosh Yeshiva of the Frankfurt Yeshiva. Rav Breuer preserved in written form his *Shabbos* and *Yom Tov* shul sermons, which were built on original interpretations of various Midrashic sources, and included moving inspirational messages and timeless lessons for our people. Rav Breuer's sermons are a rich source of wisdom and exhortation --- *Chochmo u'Mussar*.




