UPDATED NOTICE (10/2/20)

As with other Shuls around the world, protection against the COVID19 virus is requiring the implementation of changes to our normal routine and Minyonim. Our Shul is no exception. Some of these changes may be difficult but we are trying to work within the CDC and New York State guidelines and ask for your cooperation and understanding as we try to ensure everyone's safety.

<u>Shul</u>

- Anyone who enters into Shul must wear a mask covering both their mouth and nose at all times. **No exceptions!**
- If you find it difficult to keep your face covered, please step outside
- Social distancing is required. To accomplish this, please only sit in a seat with a blue tape.
- Although home care aides may accompany a person to and from their seats, they should not remain in Shul for davening.

Sukkos

- For those eating in the non-catered Sukka, tables cannot be reserved. Tables should be used on a first come, first serve basis. The possibility exists that it may be required to eat in shifts. If so, please move along your meal if others are waiting.
- For those eating in the catered Sukka, if you have made reservations, please do not call or e-mail regarding seating. Every effort is being made to provide social distancing. If on the chance the seating does not meet your distancing requirements, a second shift will be made available.
- When in the Sukkah, just like shul, please respect everyone's comfort level when it comes to social distancing, so please wear a mask when walking around.
- On Yom Tov and Chol HaMoed, please ensure distancing during Hakofos.
- On Simchas Torah there are many Shuls eliminating all extra activities. To provide some measure of the Yom Tov the Board has decided on the following:
- There should be no individual candy distribution. Instead, the Kehilla is distributing special packages for the children.
- Children should line up maintaining a 6-foot distance between families at the beginning of the 3rd hakafa both by night and by day in the playground. Barring extenuating circumstances, such as children in quarantine, packages will only be given to children present for the distribution.
- Hakofos will be limited. The issuing of the Sifrei Torahs will be limited. The Sifrei Torah will be taken around Shul as usual. Other than this there should be no dancing.

- Boys will not be permitted to come to the Bima for the Kol HaNe'orim aliyo on Simchas Torah. To arrange for their names to be read in the mi sheberach made by the ba'al korei after the Kol HaNe'orim aliyo, names must be submitted in advance by going to https://www.kajinc.org/form/Kol%20HaNe'orim%20Names. Please only list names of boys whom you anticipate will be in shul for the aliyo. Please submit a separate form for each boy.


Megillas Koheles
