## ISRAEL AT 75 BY RABBI BRIAN STRAUSS

"I see the rifts and fissures between us, which are becoming deeper and more painful at this time, and I cannot help but reflect seriously on the fact that, twice in history, a Jewish state arose in the Land of Israel, and twice it collapsed before reaching its 80th year," said the

president of Israel, Isaac Herzog, noting that Israel was coming up for its 75th Anniversary.

We have much to be thankful for as the State of Israel celebrates its 75th Anniversary this month (*April 26*). The founders of Israel could never have imagined just how successful Israel would become. Israel's technological and economic accomplishments are second to none. Our Jewish state's cultural and religious contributions have forever changed world Jewry for the better. Even with the challenges of war and terrorism, a majority of Jews in the world will soon live in Israel. The tremendous Zionist spirit is alive and well.

Despite being proud of her accomplishments, my celebration of Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israel Independence Day) is tempered with concern. We have become accustomed to Israel's problems dealing with her external enemies. But today, the headlines are about internal strife. Israel is now undergoing one of the most consequential crises in its history. Given the lack of a constitution and the deep divisions within Israeli society, both sides of the political spectrum are trying to define the future of judicial review. After seventy-five years, the State of Israel has reached the point of needing to determine its version of democracy.

Can a national consensus be reached to bridge the gaps between different parts of Israeli society? Are there constructive steps we American Jews can take to help? Some moderate Israelis on the center-left and center-right are trying to build a sustainable and democratic political and civil society in Israel. The number one step we can take is to support Israeli organizations that align with our values. I invite you to go to our Conservative Movement in Israel – Masorti.org. Thousands of Masorti Movement Israelis are building communities embodying a democratic vision of Jewish life in Israel. Their spirit is pioneering, combining modern Israeli life with traditional Jewish belief while promoting equality and inclusion. They need and deserve our partnership.

We American Jews can play an essential role in helping to ensure that Israel celebrates many more important anniversaries as a flourishing Jewish democracy. Let's all do our part to help make this happen.

Holocaust Museum Houston to host Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day observance event on April 16

Holocaust Museum Houston (HMH) will host the annual Yom HaShoah observance at Congregation Emanu El, 1500 Sunset Blvd, at 3 p.m. Sunday, April 16.

During this citywide commemoration, the community mourns the loss of the 6 million Jewish people who perished in the Holocaust, honors those who survived and comes together to remember and reflect. The ceremony, led by Rabbi Oren Hayon and Rabbi Deborah Schloss includes remarks by HMH Chair Barbara J. Herz and the Honorable Livia Link-Raviv, Consul General of Israel to the Southwest, songs from local cantors, a Holocaust survivor testimony from Edith Jucker and a candle lighting ceremony.

Holocaust Museum Houston is dedicated all year-round to teaching the lessons of the Holocaust and bringing awareness to the dangers of hatred, prejudice and apathy. The Museum would like to congratulate the winner of the 2023 Holocaust Museum Houston Yom HaShoah Scholarship competition, Maya Friedberg, a senior at The Emery/Weiner School.



#### Mind the Museum



Just how do they get all those holes in the matzahs anyway? Well, things were different 100 years ago. This "matzah perforator" is made of wood and Bakelite. In the making of matzah, once the dough has been rolled, a perforator is used before baking to allow the heat to penetrate as rapidly as possible; this reduces the time in which leavening might occur. This instrument consists of eight individual roundels of spikes next to each other. They rotate as the instrument is pushed over the wet matzah dough to make the holes before baking. The workers' hands must have been wet at all times as was the dough and the spikes had to be cleaned frequently in water. This is a ritual instrument not usually seen by the matzah buying public or ever outside a factory.

The Museum is open 10<sub>AM</sub>-2<sub>PM</sub> Monday through Thursday; guided tours by appointment. The collection is open to congregants whenever the building is open. For nonmembers an appointment is required. Various groups, both Jewish and non-Jewish, take advantage of the opportunity to visit the collection each year, and docents can be arranged for groups that wish to use them.
