To engage members of all ages in tefillah (Jewish prayer) takes a unique skill set. Fortunately, we have found the ideal Senior Cantor to fulfill these tasks and more. I cannot wait for you to meet my new friend and colleague Cantor Rachel Goldman.

With her talents, personality, character, and genuine passion for Jewish life, she will inspire us to lead more spiritual lives. Her voice is uplifting, engaging, and moving. Her personality is magnetic. She truly engages with people, understanding their needs. She will deepen our engagement with God and our tradition.

Cantor Rachel Goldman has served as Cantor at Congregation Ner Tamid of South Bay in Rancho Palos Verdes, CA for the past six years. Cantor Goldman likes to keep worship services varied and exciting—while she is an enthusiast of traditional nusach, she is not afraid of attempting to set liturgy to the music of Journey, Queen, or Lady Gaga.

Prior to joining Congregation Ner Tamid, Cantor Goldman served for over seven years at Congregation Beit T'Shuvah, a synagogue and full inpatient addiction rehabilitation center that incorporates Jewish teachings along with 12-step modules and clinical psychotherapy. Cantor Goldman is passionate about helping to end the stigmatization surrounding mental illness, especially within the Jewish community.

A native of Los Angeles, she began her vocal training in the highly-acclaimed Los Angeles Children's Chorus and had sung with the LA Opera before reaching college. As a sought-after concert soloist, Cantor Goldman's voice has been heard in venues such as the Hollywood Ford Theater, the Houston Hobby Center, and the Hollywood Bowl with ensembles such as the Houston Symphony, the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and the Los Angeles Jewish Symphony. Cantor Goldman received her Bachelor of Arts in Jewish Studies from the American Jewish University in Los Angeles. She was ordained as Hazzan at the Academy of Jewish Religion, California and holds a Master's Degree from the same institution.

Cantor Goldman is a proud member of both the Cantors Assembly and the American Conference of Cantors, and has spearheaded multiple Cantorial collaborative projects on both national and international levels. She has co-founded two Cantorial collaborative groups: Guys and Meidels, a Los-Angeles-based quartet which infuses classical Jewish and Cantorial music with millennial energy, and Shul Sisters, a cross-country female-driven Cantor trio.

Beth Yeshurun has been blessed with world-class Cantors. Cantor Goldman will become the fourth Cantor to serve our 1,800-family synagogue since Adath Yeshurun merged with Beth El in 1946. You will soon see that she is more than worthy to serve as our Senior Cantor. I hope you will come meet her soon.

Finally, please save the dates, June 18 – 29, 2023. Cantor Goldman and her husband Chris will be joining Lisa and me for a memorable Beth Yeshurun Congregational Trip to Israel. Next summer, we will celebrate Israel's 75th Birthday together in the Jewish homeland.

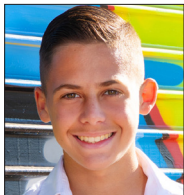

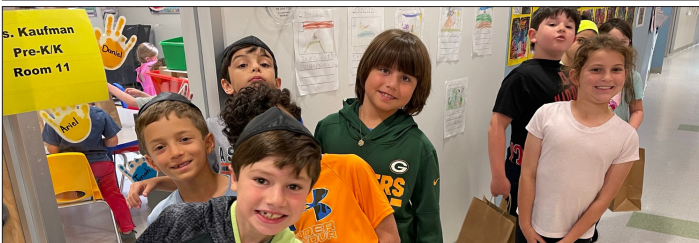

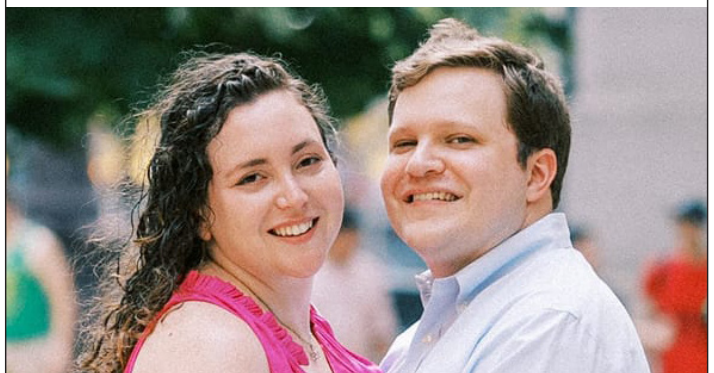
July brought several changes to our Staff and Clergy. We hope you'll join us in wishing only the best for those taking on new adventures and welcoming new faces!

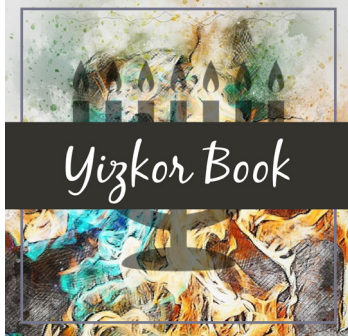
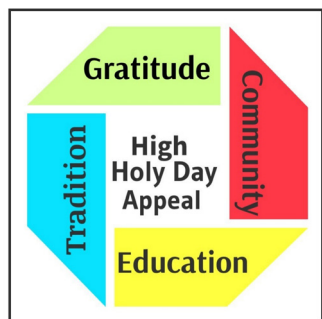

Teen Jewish History Course



Eight Houston-area teens learned that it pays to study Jewish history. Olivia (Liv) Rubenstein, Seth Gratz, Sam Toubin, Sam Goldfarb, Dylan Kessler, Ari Strauss, Koby Sheldon and Reuben Kessler all won large cash prizes through their participation in the Houston community's Jewish history course for high school students. The course culminated with an awards ceremony on May 30.

\$5,700 in prize money was awarded to the teens. Rubenstein, a St. John's School senior, took home the first-place prize of \$1,250. Gratz, Toubin and Goldfarb, Clements high school, HSPVA and Emery high school students, respectively, tied for second place, each earning \$850. Third-place winner Dylan Kessler (Emery) earned \$600, Strauss and Sheldon (both

Emery), tied for fourth place, earning \$500 and fifth-place winner Reuben Kessler (Emery) earned \$300.

The course was open to Houston-area high school juniors and seniors. Ten students participated in the class, from various high schools, synagogues and temples in our community. The students explored some 2,000 years of Jewish history, on which they were tested. Rubenstein said, "Having completed Mr. Lefkowitz's course, I not only have a good grip on Jewish history, but a new passion!" Dylan Kessler said, "This class has been hugely influential in helping me explore my Jewish identity and history."

Jeff Lefkowitz, the course teacher, was impressed. "These kids have so many time pressures due to advanced placement classes, college applications, sports and other activities. But they chose to participate in this course, stuck with it and excelled. They are good role models, and I'm proud of them."

Rabbi Brian Strauss, Senior Rabbi, Congregation Beth Yeshurun said, "I am so impressed with the commitment, passion and love for Jewish history that was displayed by these students. With young people like these, our future is in good hands."
