Message from Rabbi Steven Morgen

I ate bacon in college.

Well, in my freshman year I did, anyway.

My parents did not keep kosher, exactly. They were serious Reform Jews. Both of them taught in the

religious school at the Temple in Tucson. My father went "religiously" to Friday night services, and even Saturday morning services. But we didn't buy kosher meat. We did not separate meat from dairy when we ate. On the other hand, we did not have bacon or shellfish at home. So, when I went away to college... well, I thought I might as well find out what I was missing.

After my first year, though, I decided that bacon (or other pork products) were not for me. I never really ate shellfish.

My roommates for the next three years of college kept kosher, so I learned how to shop and keep a kosher kitchen.

As a rabbinical student I wrote and edited the text for a CD the Conservative Movement produced on Kashrut. Shortly after I wrote it, CD's became obsolete. Oh well.

Anyway, that is all to say that we have an exciting weekend coming up February 18-20. A classmate of mine in Rabbinical school, Dr. Joshua Kulp, will be coming to talk about "The Hungry Jew." Dr. Kulp actually didn't finish rabbinical school. The year we were in Israel he decided to apply to Bar Ilan University to get a PhD in Talmud. And now he is an outstanding scholar and teacher – and *Rosh Yeshiva* (head of the academy) – at the Conservative Yeshiva in Jerusalem.

His talk on Friday night will be about Adam and Eve and what their story teaches us about food. On Saturday he will talk about Cheeseburgers, Bacon, and Wine. Saturday night he will do a special Beer Tasting program at which he will discuss Jews and Brews. And finally, on Yom Limmud he will discuss the most famous Jewish meal of all time: the Passover Seder. He wrote a really fascinating commentary on the Passover Haggadah, and he will be sharing some of his insights on it for his Yom Limmud presentation.

Guest Speaker Judy Blake Shabbat Together: Celebrating Jewish Disability & Awareness Month Friday, February 11, 2022 at 6:00PM



Judy is a Program Coordinator for Family-to-Family Network, a Houston non-profit that provides programs that empower families of children and young adults with disabilities as they navigate the complex special education, health care and disabilities service systems. Through training, they help individuals with disabilities and their family

members define and achieve success for themselves and their loved ones. Creating opportunities and possibilities where others see barriers, she strives to change attitudes so that every individual can achieve THEIR best life.

Judy also serves on the Board and is a Family Faculty member for the LoneStar LEND Program. LEND programs are throughout the country and promote training that produces future leaders equipped to best serve underrepresented and underserved children with autism spectrum disorder and developmental disabilities. LoneStar LEND is a collaborative between UT Health Science Center/McGovern School of Medicine, Baylor College of Medicine, Texas Woman's University, University of Houston, and University of Houston - Clear Lake. She works with medical residents and fellows, graduate students, professionals, parents, and siblings of people with disabilities and self-advocates throughout a 10-month interdisciplinary training model focused on leadership, cultural competence, and evidence-based practice.

She is also the co-coordinator of the Harris County Community Resource Collaboration Group – facilitating meetings with non-profit agencies, school districts and community members conducting monthly education seminars. She also participates in staffing sessions for youth 10-17 years old who are in crisis, needing significant support.

She is also Chairperson of the Baker Ripley Health Services Advisory Committee, serves on the Board of the University of Houston Clear Lake – Center for Autism and Developmental Disabilities, and participates in Project DOCC (Delivery of Chronic Care) – sharing the "lived experience" with medical students and residents regarding the journey of raising an adult son with disabilities. She also serves two public advisory committees for The Harris Center for Mental Health and IDD.

Judy is the very proud single mother of Ryan, a wonderful 26-year-old man who was born when autism spectrum disorder was unknown to many. She quickly became his advocate, always ensuring that he was living a meaningful life.



Nick May is a singer/songwriter, educator, song leader, and inclusion activist. Raised in New Orleans by two accomplished musicians, a variety of musical influences inform his art: from contemporary Jewish folk to funk and hip hop. Being a person who stutters (PWS), Nick latched on to music as a way to fluently express himself from a young age.





Joshua Kulp is the Rosh Yeshiva at the Conservative Yeshiva in Jerusalem. Josh was born in New York City, grew up in Margate, New Jersey and attended college at the University of Michigan. In 1994 he moved to Israel and in 1995 he founded the Conservative Yeshiva where he has been teaching ever since. He is the author of two books, The Schechter Haggadah and Reconstructing the Talmud. He is the author of the Mishnah Yomit English commentary on the entire Mishnah and the Daf Shevui commentary on the Talmud, which so far covers Sukkah, Megillah and the beginning of Ketubot. Josh lives with his wife and children in Modiin.

THE HUNGRY JEW

According to the Torah, the first laws given to humanity were food laws. Adam and Eve were told not to eat from a certain tree, and a few generations later, Noah and his descendants were told not to eat the limbs of a living animal. For human beings, food is not just the calories that sustain us. Food is culture, food is history, food is identity. And no tradition has historically been more characterized by food prohibitions than Judaism. But the meaning of these laws continues to be elusive, and questions that were asked 2000 years ago remain unanswered and worthy of exploration to this day. Is it rational to eat some animals and not others, and if it is not, why observe such laws? What is the purpose of the Jewish dietary laws? Why do some Jews refrain from drinking wine or eating certain foods that were made or even touched by a non-Jews? Exploring these questions helps us gain a broad perspective on what it means to be a Jew whose Torah is full of laws that do not always seem to make rational sense.
